## A NOTE FROM FR. LANE WHILE AWAY

"A pastor friend said something so eloquently in his bulletin recently that I asked if I could reprint in ours since these were additional words I have thought and wanted to share since I wrote about this at the end of September. Fr Allen Corrigan, of Saint Victor church in Richfield had this to say about those who are leaving the church over the updated diocesan policy on gender & LGBTQ+:

I was contacted by several faithful Catholic parents regarding the pastoral care of LGBTQ+ Catholic Youth, especially their own children and grandchildren. I was deeply touched by their heartfelt concerns. I was also alarmed that in every case I heard a remark such as, "This is the last straw for me," "I've had it," or "I'm done with this."

While honoring the sentiments being expressed, for three very important reasons, I entreat all parishioners with such concerns to reflect on what is lost every time a person distances themselves from the Church, an important metaphor for which is "A Mother who loves Her children."

First, please consider the nature of the Church as the People of God and the Body of Christ in the World. The Church has a great mission, which is to share the Good News of Jesus Christ everywhere. This mission is served by human beings who struggle to square eternal values with very complicated temporal realities. I know how easy it is to fall into the trap of identifying the Church merely with its visible structure, and the frustration that can result from doing so.

Second, please keep in mind the extraordinary, irreplaceable gift of the sacramental life that connects us to God and one another as nothing else can. The fundamental act of faith, prior to its articulation in dogmas, doctrines and creeds, is that each of us is an earth-bound being, living in time and space, but whose ultimate reality is spiritual and whose final destiny is eternal. The life of grace that we share by belonging to Christ and the Church is an incomparable celebration of that mystery. To distance oneself from this wondrous exchange would result in a most regrettable spiritual impoverishment.

Third, just as it is vital to keep in mind the ultimate nature of the Church and the unparalleled treasure of the sacramental life which is our baptismal birthright, the example of love, care and support of parents, grandparents, school administrators, teachers, and clergy for LBGTQ+ Catholic Youth provides an indispensable witness to the Faithful.

Catholics believe that one of the meanings of marriage, in addition to being a gift to the couple themselves, is its sign to all of the church of the love and goodness of God for all of us. Analogously, every time parents present themselves for liturgy along with their children, it is a reminder of the goodness of our Creator.

We automatically smile with kindness, joy, and warmth when we see parents cradling infants at Mass, or small children running to rejoin their families after their special Liturgy of the Word. But when those little ones get a bit older and begin to wrestle with the mysteries of growth, human development, and identity, the cuteness fades and harder work begins. When we see parents and grandparents standing by their youthful and even adult children through struggles of all kinds, it is a powerful example of steadfast love and that is a wonderful gift to the Church.

In affirming the universal dignity of every human person and setting a place at the table for each member of its family the Church emulates a Loving Mother whose greatest joy is welcoming all of her children home and having them gathered around her.

I kindly ask all of our parishioners to treasure these truths about the nature of the Church, the gift of the sacramental life, and the powerful examples of love that we see demonstrated by others, and that we selflessly provide to them ourselves."

## REFLECTION FROM FR. ARKINS

Once again, this weekend, we heard of Jesus being in conflict with the religious Jewish leadership. Matthew tells us that a legal expert in the law tries to trip Jesus up by asking him which is the most important law in the six hundred plus laws the Jews were expected to follow in those days. In responding to the question, Jesus teaches us about our "discipleship."

Jesus answers the lawyer's question by quoting from the Book of Leviticus. What Jesus said that was new, was he equates "love of God" and "love of neighbor." He confronts the Jews on not having connected the two.

The passage from the Book of Exodus gave specific examples of love of neighbor. Scribes and Pharisees professed great love of God but failed in their love of neighbor. By putting these two passages together, our Church is reminding us that as Christ's disciples we need to love and work at both.

Paul, in his letter to the Thessalonians, praises them for living both. They welcomed him and turned to God.

We need to recognize that God's kingdom of love depends on our ability to care for one another. The scriptures this weekend invite us to personally examine ourselves individually and communally; are we are imitating the Lord or fooling ourselves?
