The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE

Author's note: Due to production schedules during the last days of December, I wrote this column on December 17. FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMLY & HAPPY NEW YEAR: Back in 1999, our church published a revised Sunday *Lectionary* for Mass with new and extra readings for feast days like today's. The purpose was to give us further reflection from Sacred Scripture on the mystery of our human life. Today, nestled in the midst of the *Gather* hymnal, we proclaim the Year B special readings to guide our own holy family (for, as Scripture says, we are God's children now!).

We hear of the great trust of Abraham and that faithfulness leading to a wife and a son. We sing of the special covenant God has with us, and we with each other in Holy Baptism. Those fruits of Abraham and Sarah's obedience led to God promising to be with us forever – so helpful when we are raising our family. Lastly, the Year B Gospel invites us to reflect on the presentation of Jesus in the temple, the faithful people who worship there (Simeon and Anna) and our realization that it is through worship and service in which our families grow – becoming stronger and filled with the wisdom of God within us! May the coming year be an opportunity to invite our church family to return to worship and faithful stewardship; God has blessed us, and He is with us forever. How can we keep from singing? How can we keep from praising and thanking God? Mass is not about us and what I get out of it – it's about giving back to God and God's people. Thanks for understanding this as we grow as a parish family.

HELP WITH OUR RENOVATIONS OF O'BRIEN HALL: The two most used spaces on our campus need our help: a refresh and more. First, our beloved first church has been O'Brien Hall (named after our first pastor) since 1971. The last renovation of the space was in 1974 when it became a Bingo Hall and full-time cafeteria. It's also used for PSR, Band, Scouts, Craft Shows and other big events for us on the weekends. While it has a new HVAC system and a 10-year-old roof, the interior needs our loving care, updated bathrooms, a Family Bathroom space and much more.

Meanwhile, the Eymard Room of the Family Life Center is a 22-yearold facility and needs a new roof, new ceiling, expanded storage, updated kitchen equipment and a finishing of the dishwashing system that was not completed in 2001. Plus, other items that others have identified – and so may you! This is where we need your help! (Thanks to your 2nd collection gifts to maintenance and loan repayment, we were able to replace all six HVAC units on the top of the Family Life Center! Thanks for that generosity each month!)

In the past year (since the reception of the challenge grant in December 2022), we have had focus groups and large groups receive your input. Since August, we have had an architect team (studioTECHNE)

working with us, and now, they wish to present some options for moving forward. They have heard our feedback, and they want to make sure they got it correctly noted. Concept plans will be presented to us *before finalizing anything!!* Additionally, we have engaged a fundraising company (Jack Kearns) that will explain our feasibility study and timeline for fundraising for this project in the coming year.

Come be part of our SPB history in setting the direction for these two spaces! Join us for the TOWN HALL MEETING, MONDAY, JANUARY 8, 6:30 PM in the EYMARD ROOM.

EUCHARIST IS A VERB, NOUN, ADVERB, ADJECTIVE AND INTERJECTION! Join me in this national workshop that we are videotaping here in our church where we learn more about the most important things we do as a Catholic – celebrate the Eucharist. He was known for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist, which became a center theme of his life. He was beatified by the Catholic Church on October 10, 2020, two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. He was inspired to create an online website dedicated to cataloging each reported Eucharistic miracle in the world, as a new way to share about faith with the younger generation."
