When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE

Author's note: Due to production schedules during the last days of December, I wrote this column on December 23. A detailed list of appreciation for ALL the hard work of Christmas Time will be in a future bulletin. The image of Pope Francis is from public domain photos.



SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD, BAPTISM OF THE LORD & HAPPY NEW YEAR: One of the aspects of the Christmas Season – our liturgical calendar – is the extension of the octave (8 days), and the other days are of "manifestation" of the incarnation. We know that the incarnation of God becoming one of us is the key mystery of our salvation; without Christ being born, being revealed to Magi and revealed in the Jordan River, we would not know the

gift of God among us as the key to our salvation from sin. The early church councils and creeds spent time acknowledging the gift of God among us. The Magi, that we focus on this weekend, remind us of the glory of God and the gifts that we are to bring and give back to God—from the God who first "gifted us." We have all we have only because of God. This is why, to this day, we give gifts to God, our tithing, our talents, and other elements of sharing with God and the rest of the Body of Christ.

MONDAY, JANUARY 8, IS THE FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD. This year like last, we have a very short Christmas Time, just as we had a short Advent Time. (It's just the way the calendar falls every 5 or 6 years, especially with Easter falling as it does with the first full moon of the vernal equinox, and the Sunday following these two events.) This Baptism event of Christ recalls our own JOY when we each were told (through the ritual) that we are a beloved child of God, part of God's family forever. We are a gift to our parents and the church when we become a Christian, baptized as royal person, a priestly-serving person and a prophet. Being "chrismated" when we are anointed at our Baptism, we take on this anointed task to serve as a disciple of Christ forever, a covenant with God, like we do at every Mass. We are renewed when we sign ourselves with holy water and receive Holy Communion. We renew ourselves when we serve the Body of Christ.

In this new year, which aspect of my Baptism do I need to focus on and/or serve better? How can I make an offer to God and God's church? Who needs my service these days? Part of our new year's resolution during these last days of Christmas Time, is a chance for us to renew our baptismal promise.

ADVENT WENT SO WELL! ...and it was so quick! I thank Cheryl Arstein and the Art & Environment Committee along with the maintenance staff for their "Journey to Bethlehem" theme whereby each week items were added to our sanctuary. We also thank Kris Platko and our students for making art to adorn the perimeter of the church. Evamarie Cross, Youth Minister and our Youth Group did an amazing job with our Carols, Cocoa and Cookies. As always, Brother Gary LaVerdiere, SSS and his team did an amazing job of having the SSS Outdoor Manger sparkling and glowing again this year. With great weather, we had our largest group of carolers with 100 joining us.

ORDINARY TIME BEGINS TUESDAY THROUGH ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14: The first part of the church liturgical season, Ordinary Time, begins Tuesday. The Roman Catholic church's liturgical calendar returns to this 34-week cycle and begins again with the Year II weekday lectionary cycle. For those new to weekday Mass, we encourage you, as a New Year's resolution, to attend weekday Masses, either at 9:00 AM in the church or at 11:30 AM in Saint Ann Shrine. (The Shrine is in the Oratory of the Blessed Sacrament, so park in the horseshoe lot off Wilson Mills Road.) If you have other times to give thanks to God during the day, join us for the 8:00 AM Morning Prayer, 8:30 AM Rosary (both of these in the church) and 4:30 PM Evening Prayer (in the church's chapel). Part of a great routine of prayer and thanksgiving you can add to your regular weekday routine. Also, here's a note about Ash Wednesday which is earlier this year due to the events mentioned above; we have our regular Holy Day Mass times (though in Catholic trivia, Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation!). We also return this year with our special Service of the Word and Distribution of Ashes at 4:00 PM with our Co-director of the Center for Eucharistic Evangelizing, (also headquartered in our Blessed Sacrament Community building) Mona Grigsby-Suarez. Just a reminder of this valid liturgical event that we have celebrated now for 15 years with different prayer leaders, the order of service for this 25-minute celebration is:

- Opening Song & Prayer
- Reading (one) & Psalm
- Reflection (5 minutes)
- Distribution of Ashes
- Intercessions & Lord's Prayer
- Announcements, Closing Prayer & Song
- Envelopes for the collection left at the Holy Water stoops, rice bowls left around the church for pickup.

LITURGICAL NOTE: After the Paschaltide liturgical seasons (Lent – Triduum – Easter), Ordinary Time returns on May 20.



RECENT DOCUMENT BY THE POPE: On December 18, 2023, Pope Francis and his Cardinal Prefect of the Dicastery for the

Cardinal Prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith wrote a pastoral response to cardinals who wondered about blessings for people who are not in right relationships with the church – divorced, same sex marriage and other situations in life. Cardinals of the church asked for clarification because in some cases, priests, deacons or bishops would not bless

certain folks for whatever their reality was. I encourage you to read the declaration Fiducia *Supplicans – On the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings*. As our Bishop Malesic wrote...

Because so many of yesterday's headlines and news reports were misleading regarding the actual content of the document, we strongly recommend that during this time of Eucharistic Revival that you set aside thirty minutes and take the document before the Blessed Sacrament and read it carefully and prayerfully. Please understand that the Holy See has in no way changed or developed Church teaching on the nature of marriage. (FS, 4) The real development presented in the document is on the nature of blessings. Therefore, the nuances of these developments and the distinctions presented about blessings contained in this document are important for us all to understand clearly.

The **Declaration** issued today by the Vatican's Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF) articulated a distinction between

liturgical (sacramental) blessings, and pastoral blessings, which may be given to persons who desire God's loving grace in their lives. The Church's teaching on marriage has not changed, and this declaration affirms that, while also making an effort to accompany people through the imparting of pastoral blessings because each of us needs God's healing love and mercy in our lives. (See also the USCCB Statement issued 18 December 2023.)

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, approved a recent **document** issued by the Vatican that has made it clear that anyone who has the intention of seeking God's help in living holy lives may request a blessing from the Church. Such people, including those who are in marriages not recognized by the Church (and those in same-sex relationships), can be spontaneously blessed by the Church's ministers when they ask for God's strength and help in responding to His will. When people ask for a blessing from the Church, the Holy Father rightfully calls us to see it as a sign that they wish to do God's will and that they, like all of us, need God's help to do it.

If you have any further questions for clarification, please do not hesitate to ask me!

MONDAY NIGHT TOWN HALL MEETING – OUR RENOVATIONS OF O'BRIEN HALL: The two most used spaces on our campus need our help and a refresh, or even more. First, our beloved first church has been O'Brien Hall (named after our first pastor) since 1971. The last renovation of the space was in 1974 when it became a Bingo Hall and full-time cafeteria. It's also used for PSR, Band, Scouts, Craft Shows and other big events for us on the weekends. While it has a new HVAC system, and a 10-year-old roof, the interior needs our loving care, updated bathrooms, a Family Bathroom space and much more.

Meanwhile, the Eymard Room of the Family Life Center is a 22-yearold facility and needs a new roof, new ceiling, expanded storage, updated kitchen equipment and finishing of the dishwashing system that was not completed in 2001. Plus, other items that others have identified – and so may you! That's where we need your help! (Thanks to your 2nd collection gifts to maintenance and loan repayment, we were able to replace all six HVAC units on the top of the Family Life Center! Thanks for that generosity each month!)

In the past year (since the reception of the challenge grant in December 2022), we have had focus groups and large groups to receive your input. Since August, we have had an architect team (studioTECHNE) working with us, and now they wish to present some options for moving forward. They have heard our feedback, and they want to make sure they got it correctly noted. They will present concept plans to us <u>before finalizing anything!!</u> Additionally, we have engaged a fundraising company (Jack Kearns) who will explain our feasibility study and timeline for fundraising for this project in the coming year. Come be part of our SPB history in setting the direction for these two spaces! Join with us in the TOWN HALL MEETING, MONDAY, JANUARY 8, 6:30pm in the EYMARD ROOM.

He was beatified by the Catholic Church on October 10, 2020, two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. He was inspired to create an online website dedicated to cataloging each reported Eucharistic miracle in the world, as a new way to share about faith with the younger generation." 
