

Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME: Years ago, the United States church celebrated this week as "vocation week." The choice was clear due to the readings of our Mass today. We hear the call of Samuel and the first

disciples. John's Gospel invites us still to ponder our call in the Lord. The Lord calls us to see and serve – each day! God joyfully gives us, like Peter, a nickname too, perhaps? That's how close God wishes to be to us, so close that He calls us by a special name to be the serving disciple. How do we respond?

In this New Year, we reflect on what God is calling us to be and do for our vocation at this season of life. In less than a month, we will have our Ministry Fair. They join Roberta, our music/liturgy director, our super volunteer Steve Kuerbitz on organ and Steve Engstrom on trumpet to share their talents and help us bring glory to God! CELEBRATE BROTHER GARY'S 60th: It's hard to believe that our Bro Gary LaVerdiere, SSS, is celebrating his 60th anniversary of profession with us on Sunday, February 11. Let us celebrate him and his faithful witness of religious life as a brother in the Congregation at the 10:30 AM Sunday Mass and a reception afterward in the Eymard Room. It will be during the Ministry Fair, too. We will have a special blessing for him on this day and give thanks to God for his service to Saint Paschal Baylon and the Blessed Sacrament Community. Bro Gary was on our parish pastoral staff from 1975 to 1995. He continues to serve us with his annual outdoor manger, gardening and as the SSS House Manager. We are grateful for his ministry!



RECENT DOCUMENT BY THE POPE: On December 18, 2023, Pope Francis and his Cardinal Prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith wrote a pastoral response to cardinals who wondered about blessings for people who are not in right relationships with the church, divorced, same sex marriage and other situations in life. Cardinals of the church asked for clarification because in some cases, priests, deacons or bishops

would not bless certain folks for whatever their reality. I encourage you to read the declaration Fiducia *Supplicans – On the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings*. As our Bishop Malesic wrote...

"Because so many of yesterday's headlines and news reports were misleading regarding the actual content of the document, we strongly recommend that during this time of Eucharistic Revival that you set aside thirty minutes and take the document before the Blessed Sacrament and read it carefully and prayerfully. Please understand that the Holy See has in no way changed or developed Church teaching on the nature of marriage. (FS, 4) The real development presented in the document is on the nature of blessings. Therefore, the nuances of these developments and the distinctions presented about blessings contained in this document are important for us all to understand clearly.

"The **Declaration** issued today by the Vatican's Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF) articulated a distinction between liturgical (sacramental) blessings, and pastoral blessings, which may be given to persons who desire God's loving grace in their lives. The Church's teaching on marriage has not changed, and this declaration affirms that, while also making an effort to accompany people through the imparting of pastoral blessings because each of us needs God's healing love and mercy in our lives. (See also the USCCB Statement issued 18 December 2023.)

"The Holy Father, Pope Francis, approved a recent **document** issued by the Vatican that has made it clear that anyone who has the intention of seeking God's help in living holy lives may request a blessing from the Church. Such people, including those who are in marriages not recognized by the Church (and those in same-sex relationships), can be spontaneously blessed by the Church's ministers when they ask for God's strength and help in responding to His will. When people ask for a blessing from the Church, the Holy Father rightfully calls us to see it as a sign that they wish to do God's will and that they, like all of us, need God's help to do it."

He was known for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist, which became a center theme of his life. He was beatified by the Catholic Church on October 10, 2020, two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. He was inspired to create an online website dedicated to cataloging each reported Eucharistic miracle in the world, as a new way to share about faith with the younger generation."
