A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



5th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME & CONSECRATED LIFE SUNDAY: In the second reading, Paul identifies that Jesus is preaching and his preaching was going to be about enthusiasm for Christ and the love, care and relief that He brings. Paul sees us as preaching with our lives—sometimes using words. Do

we seem that we are preachers – fulfilling our baptismal covenant? Just as we identify with Job in his suffering, we should also identity with Paul in his commitment to evangelization and preaching. We tend to focus on the negative or the glass "half-empty." No matter what happens in our own life, we are the disciples who must bring the Good News to the brokenhearted, to those who are enslaved, to those who are weak. We are the ones who will then share in the blessings and in Good News!



We do this in our vocation – preaching love, unity and care as the stronghold of matrimony, single life and consecrated life or ordained. Do couples preach this with their beautiful witness? This weekend, the church asks us to reflect upon consecrated religious and their vocation. Called to devote one's life to the Gospel of Christ, sisters, nuns, brothers, monks and religious deacons and priests are called to show a special way to living the Gospel. Through vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, we are seeing in the two religious orders that are here at SPB, folks who have devoted

their life to this service of Christ. Next weekend, we celebrate one consecrated religious who has shared this in a very special way since 1975 here at SPB.

CELEBRATE BRO GARY'S 60th: It's hard to believe that our Bro Gary LaVerdiere SSS is celebrating his 60th anniversary of profession with us on Sunday, February 11. Let's celebrate him and his faithful witness of religious life as a brother in the Congregation at the 10:30 AM Sunday Mass with a reception afterward in the Eymard Room. It will be during the Ministry Fair, too. We will have a special blessing for him on this day, and we will give thanks to God for his service to Saint Paschal Baylon and the Blessed Sacrament Community. Bro Gary was on our parish pastoral staff from 1975 to 1995. He continues to serve us with his annual outdoor manger, gardening and as the SSS House Manager. We are grateful for his ministry!

TOWN HALL & O'BRIEN HALL UPDATE: We had an outstanding Town Hall Meeting on January 8 with 50 parishioners attending, members from the cross section of the parish including leaders of the Ladies Guild, PTO, Finance Council and Pastoral Council. We saw proposals from our architect firm and gave concrete feedback to the conceptional drawings. We had a lot of energy around having a worthy place for the band, improved cafeteria for OBH and a better functioning kitchen for both OBH and the Eymard Room of the Family Life Center. This week, our Steering Committee will meet with the architects to take the recommendations from the Town Hall and present them for final conceptual/3-D presentations for our fundraising.

Also at the meeting was our fundraising company, Jack Kearns, who is in the midst of doing a feasibility study for the parish and also beginning the process of identifying families to lead this project. THANKS FOR YOUR ONGOING SUPPORT and prayers for a successful process.

OUR FAITH FORMATION – PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION AND CATHOLIC SCHOOL'S WEEK ENDS: With two hats as pastor and provincial superior, it is hard for me to be at everything important for each job. I apologize for not being here to end Catholic Schools Week, as usual, due to the installation of



Fr. Sekar (pictured elsewhere in my column) in Houston at our SSS parish there. As provincial, I will be part of the ritual and presenting him to the bishop (representative) and parish in the ritual. I will also be preaching and will share part of this homily in my next bulletin column.


