FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT FEBRUARY 18, 2024

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: Our counting of the 40 days of Lent begins today and goes on until Holy Thursday. In Year B, Mark gives us a brief account of Jesus' time in the desert and His temptation. Just a sentence! More important in this Gospel is the proclamation of the Gospel of God, a time of fulfillment, of God's reign, repentance and belief in the Gospel. On Ash Wednesday, we

heard the person who placed ashes upon our forehead: Repent and believe in the Gospel! We remember this phrase and our own time now to repent, to show others how we believe and to renew our lives, even through the temptations that come our way. What Lenten resolution will deepen your relationship with God?

CATHOLIC CHARITIES: Last weekend officially kicked off the 2024 Appeal, "Transformed by Your Love." We also had a great Ministry Fair last weekend, and we invite you to consider that during Lent, you take time in sharing your talent with our parish matching your gifts with our needs. On behalf of the ministries, thank you! On behalf of the folks you will sacrifice a coffee or meal for, thank you! The work our Catholic church does to support people is amazing: thanks for being a faithful steward of God's blessings in your life.

THIS WEEK'S PHOTOS: What a joyous night of Reconciliation on Tuesday, February 6 with our second graders. The top photo is the Smith family. Elsewhere, we have the grace-filled families with our great catechist Kathy Sanson. We have several opportunities to feel this happy, this reconciled to God. Weekdays, from 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM, we usually have a priest on duty to hear your Confession in our special office confessional. The sacrament is available on Saturdays, 3:30-4:15 PM, before Mass. Notice in the Lenten Calendar the other communal celebrations whereby we celebrate God's Scripture and also have individual Confessions.

SUGGESTION BOX & FIRESIDE CHAT: I know that many of you enjoy my highlights from our Pastoral Council Suggestion Box review and Fireside Chat. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE MONEY IN THE SUGGESTION BOX! Someone left a check for \$1,000. Place in the collection basket instead so that there is no delay in processing items. Here's other items that the Pastoral Council discussed:

• *Music.* Several comments were about the "new songs," some about "Can't we have more new songs?" or, "Why don't we sing more?" or "Why do we sing more than other churches?" We also have the annual reflection on Christmas or other songs that folks would like us to sing, even every week.

Let me take a moment to share that Pope Francis and his Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith just came out with a document last week about insisting priests and pastors following the rubrics and texts of the Mass. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM), that big red book that we use at the priest's stand or on the altar has these rubrics. Most of the Mass is supposed to be sung; there is the principle of "progressive solemnity," meaning that at certain times of the year we sing more or less depending on Advent, Christmas, Lent, Triduum, Easter Time or Ordinary Time. Going back into a "high, holy season" like Lent, we sing more, and we actually follow the actual music that is in the *Roman Missal* that you see in the hymnal or missalettes.

Being a Eucharistic parish, we especially follow these special rubrics, meaning, we offer the Body *and Blood of Christ* most as Christ commanded. Both species are offered for you to receive (or not), but it is supposed to be offered as are the parts of the Mass that some other places skip or omit (not giving you the option to participate and enjoy). Our Liturgy Commission and Blessed Sacrament Community has been formed in the spirit of the Second Vatican Council, and I am so grateful for all they do to enhance, follow and live the liturgy so well. We also follow the rubric in the GIRM for silence after Communion. This is a special time of personal prayer after all the communal celebrating. Some don't feel it's long enough, but that's what our prayer later, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, calls us to be and do.

We wish that everyone loves SPB's style, and we hope those who don't, come to admire our love and grow in acceptance of our ways. I get it, having vacation across the world, seeing Masses that are 20-minute marathons with a buzz word for the homily to 90-minute celebrations with long pauses, more sung than we do, 20-minute homilies, etcetera, we really try to balance the old, the young, the new, the traditional, the different languages and cultures here and come up with a compromise that has the best for us to all worship God; for that's the point – praising God and taking some time to do this, since the phrase has always been, "Could you not spend an hour?" We celebrate most frequently for less than an hour. As I said before, we are blessed to have such a great team of liturgical ministries – they work so hard for you to assist you in worshipping God. They spend long hours here; let's thank them as often as we can!

• Abortion & Signs on the Lawn. As I mentioned through the fall, based on a few of us being abused, shoved and harassed, we decided to make SPB a safe place for no hate. Unfortunately, the notes we received on these topics did not follow the guidelines of love. The Pastoral Council feels that we cover all respective life issues well. As one person said, "I am so grateful, as an 81-year-old woman you do not preach about me not having an abortion like other churches do. I can't have children and the priest should read the room at other parishes." Most people in the world know quite clearly how the church stands on issues; we do not hammer that at you because we are sensitive to the women who are not able to conceive or have had abortions and whom we wish to make feel welcome, accepted and loved.

There was one two-page letter that was anonymous; it was not very kind about SPB or me. It was even sent to the bishop. One should know that the policy of the bishop is to not respond to anonymous letters; they go in the shredder.

- Is there a reason that the [outside] bells stopped playing, "Let there be peace on earth?" Want to hear them ring that again. Yes, a power outage wiped out the program and it just has to have this redone. During Lent, however, we fast from the bells and use our "sound bowl" to begin our Masses after our period of meditation.
- Longtime member (52 years) of the parish was disappointed in the lack of respect, care and good dress for Mass by our liturgical ministers. Several times, people are called into service at Mass who have not known that they were going to be a minister. We need the assistance!
- Thank you for your continued "acceptance" policy. I am a straight elderly grandmother. I agree with you. People who are "different" suffer a lot of pain; let's not add to it. Thank you for your pastoral sensitivity and sharing this spirit of welcome before, during (Sign of Peace) and after Mass.

Please stop doing the announcements during Mass. That's so 70's. Lacks reverence. The GIRM of the Mass allows for announcements as we do them; many of our groups want to remind you of their special invitations to join something special in the life of the parish. Our worship or celebration of Mass is about building the Body of Christ and being active with Gospel living. Announcements give us a hint of the vitality of the Body of Christ's life. We will edit them down and encourage our ministries to be as brief as possible in their reminders.

Before the notes about the Fireside chat, I would also like to comment that we need four new members to Pastoral Council. This is an advisory body that guides the pastoral planning of our parish. We are currently in our 2020-2025 plan, and we review this as part of our meeting and hope to have our different leaders and ministries finalize their elements to the plan. If "visioning" or dreaming is your gift, join the Pastoral Council!

The Fireside Chat was devoted to two topics in our hour together: 1) explaining the proposals for O'Brien Hall and the Eymard Room and 2) what others can do to assist me in my two full-time positions as pastor and provincial. I'll comment below on OBH and Eymard below in that regular section. I appreciate the care and concern about my health – "burning the



candle at both ends." I am blessed to have a great staff and amazing volunteers to support me; I truly feel blessed and regularly delegate. Thank you for your prayers and concerns about my health.



O'BRIEN HALL & EYMARD ROOM UPDATE: Our fundraising firm, John Kearns and Associates, is in the process of doing a suitability study and needs your support in a survey and interview. Please contact, even anonymously, Michelle Mazza at mmazza@

saintpaschal.com for time with Jack Kearns on our future capital campaign. Please be interviewed! Please share your joys of SPB, improvements to SPB and your ideas about the dreams to renovate these two important spaces on our campus. You may do this anonymously through the company we have hired. There will also be in-pew surveys March 2-3 and 9-10 with our Paschal Life email, SPB Family Newsletter in the school and with you just writing Michelle and Jack.

The Steering Committee met the architects to finalize concept drawings before going to the next steps. They identified key points that we heard and want to see:

- Dedicated band space
- Renovated bathrooms by OBH and a Family Restroom
- Renovated/expanded OBH kitchen
- Expansion of storage in OBH and Eymard
- Refresh of Eymard after the roof is replaced
- Renovated/expansion of Eymard kitchen; enclosing a new storage space in the bay that was never used for trash containers

I am grateful to all the ministries that provided a "booth" and for our Welcome Committee, Chris Hart and Ladies Guild for hosting such great receptions. He was known for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist, which became a center theme of his life. He was beatified by the Catholic Church on October 10, 2020, two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. He was inspired to create an online website dedicated to cataloging each reported Eucharistic miracle in the world, as a new way to share about faith with the younger generation." 




