When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL: While today is a solemnity, it is the rare one that is only a day of obligation when it is on a Sunday. Our readings highlight the key aspects that made these men famous for their role in the church's life. It was rare that the paths of these two men crossed, at least from what we know from tradition/Scripture. They are a study in contrasts and a reminder so we can be too. What drew them to share their "apostleship" was the desire to fulfill the faith and spread it to the ends of the earth, no matter the consequences. They knew their destination was to follow Christ to the heavenly banquet, as is ours! But along the way, to speak and live their truths and care for helping the church to grow and be a presence for all times.

ENDING BUDGET YEAR – COUNCIL REPORTS: I always enjoy our appreciation BBQs with our various leadership councils of the parish. At our final one, June 16, the Pastoral Council and Finance Council tentatively approved our new budget, especially for our Catholic school with, over three years, a 27% enrollment increase. We appreciate your great marketing, your stewardship and tithing. It also helps the parish in balancing its budget for our ministries and staff. Some other highlights from our meeting:

- The Family Life Center roof is in process; stones from the old roof were removed with a giant vacuum. Scaffold is up to hold the kettles and dumpster. Once the demo and new roof are in, landscaping will be replaced.
- Spring Fling 16 was a great success, and we were sad that other local festivals had such violence. We will continue with our "family day" and improve it for next year, trying a Saturday so that more parents may come at night to relax, enjoy some music and fellowship.

- We discussed the future leadership of the parish with a possible deacon, sister, brother or lay-person being a Parish Life Coordinator (PLC). I am edified that so many worry about my care and the hope that the bishop will allow our parish to maintain our excellent Blessed Sacrament Community's presence with especially the priests, and a leader to assist in the pastoring. This is because of the uncertainty of visas and our international priests who, due to immigration laws, come and go. Until we have a priest or two that has a Green Card, we do not have another SSS priest to follow in my footsteps. More to come on this discussion.
- We are grateful to our budget sub-committee, Mary Jo Grendell and Keith Clapacs (our new chair) for working with Michelle Mazza and me on the budget. As mentioned above, we tentatively passed the budget that we present to the diocese for approval.
- We thank Pat Pannitto for his six years of service on the Finance Council as he is rolling off now for term limits.

ANGEL SCHOLARSHIP SUCCESS: Thank you for sharing your \$750.00 or \$1,500.00 Ohio tax rebate with our award-winning Catholic School. Your tax rebate gift brought \$93,191.35 to our students last year and \$106,240.70 in gifts for funds available to our students for this year. We appreciate the leadership and support of George Zagar and Stephanie Kess for helping us raise awareness and instructing in the easy path to target these funds for our students. We look ahead to next year – and continue to spread the good news of this Ohio tax rebate feature!


