

Prayer in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament

Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.



A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



21st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: When I was growing up, my parents always told my brother and I to “sit up straight” or “stand up” straight so that I would not slouch and have back problems: be proud and tall. This was one of the many disciplinary ways they were with us to make us strong and orderly in our lives. They have their own book that they taught us as many of you teach your own children and grandchildren. With two of our readings today (Hebrews and Luke) focusing on the challenges of faith, discipleship and living the Christian life, it is helpful to recall the discipline and ways we are called to improve our lives to live our faith life well. It’s one reason why we go to worship at Sunday Mass and one reason we can remind our family members and friends to come to church with us to learn the ways of worship, praying and adoring God. Too many adore other things on Sunday: let’s work together to have all “stand up” and follow the commandments and precepts to worship God. Serving God and caring for others, especially on Sunday as a way to keep the Lord’s Day holy and live the discipline of the Christian life.



WELCOME, FATHER MARTIN:

Guess what happened the day after Father Choy left? We finally got approval from US Homeland Security to have another SSS priest to serve with us at SPB! What a miracle and joy to welcome Vietnamese Blessed Sacrament Father Martin Hien Tran, SSS to our Pastoral Staff. Father Martin spent the last few years in Connecticut getting an additional theological degree. He now is able to stay in the

USA until July 1, 2027 and assist us. This, with us also continuing to enjoy the ministry of Father Louis. I know you will enjoy him and getting to work with him. Thank God for the assistance! Next week, I’ll have Father Martin write an introduction about himself.

OF COLUMBUS: I am writing my column from Chicago after having visited Catholic Theological Union (CTU) and meeting with our Superior General Father Benzy Romician, SSS and the new president of CTU Father Enzo Del Brocco, CPS. And, since it is also the pope’s seminary, you can see “who” is in the reception area to greet us. The SSS have been corporate members with other religious orders for 27 years and have sent students here since the 1980s. As Father JK mentioned in his homily, he attends online and Mona Grigsby Suarez, Associate and our Director for the Center for Eucharistic Evangelizing will also be attending online, this fall. All Associates and parishioners are encouraged to pursue further theological training, especially through our seminary, CTU.

We are also getting back into the swing of things and the parish picnic always helps us focus on being our community together; that and the 125th Anniversary Celebration of the Blessed Sacrament Community in the USA were amazing events August 7 and 10. THANK YOU, KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FOR YOUR AMAZING SERVICE and care of the parish picnic with the Youth Group.

HELPING THE PARISH: We have been so blessed by generous wills that we have received as a parish to support our ongoing operational budget or special maintenance projects over the last few years, but especially last month with a \$130,000 donation to the general operations fund. In our stewardship reflections, it is helpful to know that this month is “National Make a Will Month.” Jesus responds to a question about inheritance with a call to be “rich toward God,” reminding us of the spiritual importance of how we plan and give (see Luke 12). Today, as we face the largest wealth transfer in history, parishes have both an opportunity and a responsibility to equip their communities to live and give with eternal purpose. Thanks for considering placing us in your will so that your legacy, gift and parish may grow in the future due to your generosity and kindness to the next generation of churchgoers here at SPB. While you are with us now, we are so appreciative of your thoughtfulness, generosity and support toward the ministries of our parish and also to the capital campaign, especially as you see our work being completed before our eyes.

We appreciate the hard work of our roofers and continue to pray for their safety. Hopefully, just after Labor Day, the remodel will begin and will be completed by the November Craft Show. BECOMING CATHOLIC

The three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism – Confirmation – First Communion – are inseparable once a person reaches the age of reason, that is 7 years of age. All three sacraments are placed together and celebrated by the pastor of a parish at the Easter Vigil each year. The Church’s law (Canon Law) requires certain qualifications, rituals and actions in order for this to be celebrated appropriately, especially in line with the National Statutes of the Catechumenate (USA Canon Law). Here is an outline of the session, rituals and steps along the process to become a Catholic Christian if you are 7 years of age (the canonical “age of reason”) or older. **PLACE THESE DATES ON YOUR CALENDAR – MANY ARE MANDATORY** and need special permission from the bishop to miss or make up.

NOTE: Our PSR and Day School students attend their regular religion classes and come to the Sunday Masses and dismissals for the special formation time each week.

- **Thursday, September 4, 7:00 PM** Opening Session (for adults only): The Secrets of the Church with Father Lane, SSS, and the other team members.
BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!
 - You will also have an overview of the liturgical calendar
 - Held in the Parish Office Parlor (90 minutes with questions from the group)
- **Beginning Sunday, September 14 through April 3:** Sunday Dismissals after the homily and Sunday readings for faith-sharing and information about the faith from the team leaders – at the 10:30 AM Mass each week (except during the three weeks of Lent when noted below)
 - Both adults and those 7-17 participate (parents are welcome)
- Sessions for the adults: Following Thursdays 7:00-8:30 PM **from September 4-May 21** (with breaks for the holidays)
- **Sunday, November 23, 10:30 AM Mass – Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate (with your godparent/sponsor) – Mandatory – PRACTICE at 10:00 AM beforehand**
- **Sunday, February 22, 10:30 AM – Rite of Sending at Saint Paschal Baylon**
 - Followed by lunch, a tour of the Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist, Downtown Cleveland
 - Rite of Election with **Bishop Malesic** at Public Hall – Time to be determined
 - Home by 5:00 PM. It’s a day for your godparents/sponsors and you to be together for these special rituals
- **A special ritual for those already baptized – “Rite of Penance”: Sunday, March 1, 10:30 AM Mass**

DURING LENT – YOU WILL BE WITH THE PEOPLE AT THE DIFFERENT MASS TIMES – so that they may pray for and with you, renewing their own covenant:

- **First Scrutiny:** 4:30 PM Mass on **Saturday, March 7**
- **Second Scrutiny:** 8:30 AM Mass on **Sunday, March 15**
- **Third Scrutiny:** 6:30 AM Mass on **Sunday, March 22**



PALM SUNDAY: Sunday, March 29. Attend the 10:30 AM Mass – followed by lunch provided by the parish's Welcome Committee

- Followed by a 12:30 PM Rehearsal for the Easter Vigil

One will be chosen to go to the Chrism Mass (all welcome to retrieve the oil for your Baptism!)

- **Tuesday, March 31, 7:00 PM** Cathedral of Saint John

THE SACRED TRIDUUM

- **Holy Thursday:** Agape Meal at 5:30 PM on **Thursday, April 2**, followed by 7:00 PM service
- **Good Friday:** **Friday, April 3, 7:00 PM** service – and there is a dismissal, but no reflection – you go home to prepare for the next day
- **Easter Vigil: Saturday, April 4, 8:00 PM** – You are at church at 7:30 PM to set up your towel and clothes that you will be changing into after you are baptized (yes, you get wet!); you will also be anointed with oil and receive First Communion. Students will also then be able to receive Holy Communion going forward, but especially to be part of the large group celebration on **Sunday, May 3, 2026 at 1:00 PM.**
- **Sunday, May 17, 2026, after the 10:30 AM Mass:** All join a special end-of-the-year picnic – Welcome to candidates for the next season of initiation.


