

Prayer in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament

Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

22nd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

Humbleness. Mindfulness. These are two words that strike me as key as we get to the end of this month, begin a new academic year together, continue to deepen our life as a Catholic Christian. Our culture values outlandishness, places one’s needs ahead of others. I love the first reading from the book of Sirach 3:29: **The mind of a sage appreciates proverbs. And an attentive ear is the joy of the wise.** Not only that, but we also

need to make a home for others in our hearts and minds just as God makes a “home for the poor.” (Psalm 68) How do we open ourselves to another? Thinking about it; being mindful; opening ourselves to serve the other in humbleness. These are the aspects that Christ invites us to witness as fellow disciples and Christians today. By this way, as Hebrews 12 reminds us, we are the mediators “of a new covenant,” a new way of being in our challenging world. Our world needs our witness of humbleness more than ever as the best way to serve and bring others to the new and eternal Jerusalem.

PICTURES THIS WEEK: Father Benzy, SSS (Superior General), and I are now in the air on our way to Houston to visit the SSS, Associates of the Blessed Sacrament and our parish there. As I mentioned last week, we were in Chicago and there is a picture with me in front of our old house in Chicago, still with the name in the concrete. I am with Father Benzy and in the middle is my 2nd year ministry practicum supervisor, Archdiocese of Chicago Father Donald Craig. He grew up in our former parish there, Notre Dame de Chicago and his brother was an SSS for a while before he died. We have remained friends these 35 years and he has been a trusted mentor even today. After 52 years of ministry, he still serves as a hospital chaplain. One thing we did was retrieve the 8½-foot Paschal Candle that was ours in the parish there. It has not been used since the SSS relinquished the administration of the parish 32 years ago. The current pastor allowed us to retrieve it, and we have brought it back to SPB.

September 2, 1953 Father John O’Brien and Brother Edward began a journey with the first 212 families to start this great parish. With his Irish wit, he chose an Irish mascot, Green Knights, for a predominantly Italian community at the time. He left his mark in his twenty years of service and quickly built and expanded our Catholic school and the church, which on April 8, 1971, became the parish hall named after him unanimously by the Pastoral Council and Father Joe Bernier, SSS, in 1974. Thank you for donating to the maintenance fund, and now capital campaign, to keep improving this great campus, but especially the current projects of the Eymard Room of the FLC and OBH. Happy Birthday, SPB! And we thank God for our continued growth and stewardship of time, talent and treasure to serve the needs of the parish and the outreach to the community.

On another note: I recently heard a podcast of someone who left a “mega-church” because it was too concerned about maintaining itself, money-raising, video work on their band for praise and worship music, and a lot of internal stuff without any outreach to the poor, high salaries of the ministers, etc. I am #PaschalProud that our stewardship to outreach ministries far exceeds our internal navel-gazing. We continue this as a hallmark of what has been described as the three pillars of this parish: worship, belief (education) and service.

REGULAR SEPTEMBER HAPPENINGS – IN THIS SEASON OF CREATION:

We look forward to the following events as well as our annual Season of Creation ending on Saint Francis weekend with Respect Life Sunday and month:

- **LABOR DAY:** Tomorrow, we honor and bless God for our labors with remembrance of our parish’s anniversary at the Morning Prayer at 8:00 AM, Rosary at 8:30 AM and Mass at 9:00 AM. Being the first Monday of the month, we have a special reflection with Mary Muehle. It is also the first day of the Season of Creation, first celebrated by the

Orthodox and now a joint effort of the Catholic Church too, whereby we pray for Mother Earth each day from September 1-October 4.

- **ANNUAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION AND PTO MASS, PICNIC AND BONFIRE: Saturday, September 13, 4:30 PM** in church, blessing of the athletes and potluck. Pray for good weather on the Green Knight Field.
- **GET TO KNOW (SAINT) SISTER DOROTHY KAZEL, OSU:** We will have a special Eucharistic Holy Hour on **Tuesday, September 30 at 7:00 PM** in church with a special reflection by a fellow Ursuline Sister and scripture reflections on acting with God's justice in our world. This will be hosted by the Social Action Commission.

UPDATE ON THE FAMILY LIFE

CENTER: Perhaps as you read this bulletin, the interior work of the Eymard Room in the Family Life Center is beginning its renovation, or maybe in the coming days. We finalized the colors and updates for the Eymard Room of the Family Life Center. The weather has not cooperated on the roof when we needed it to, and as many of you know some flooding, some delays and challenges and other annoyances. Construction and reconstruction always has its snags in our homes, right? So why would the church family be any different? We appreciate the hard work of our roofers and continue to pray for their safety. Hopefully, just after Labor Day, the remodel will begin and we will be completed by the November Craft Show. That's the hope – and pray for it!

COMMUNION MINISTERS MEETING: It's been a bit since we last met as a group to review our procedures for ministry during Mass. We will give an update on where to stand (i.e., those distributing the Precious Blood receive first, outer rim host ministers go next, why we do not communicate from the tabernacle until later in the Communion Rite, etc.). SECRETS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH REVEALED – PROCESS TO BECOME CATHOLIC: Last year, it was such a hit! For anyone in the parish, and for those starting the process to become Catholic, we talked about the difficult issues of the Church's history – some of our scandals, how the Church has coped and addressed them, and answered many questions again about different aspects of the governance. I'll be leading another one of these sessions, **Thursday, September 4, 7:00 PM** in the Parish Office's Parlor – park in the horseshoe lot. You are most welcome – and bring someone interested in the Catholic Church.

ALTAR SERVER TRAINING: The next session of formation for our Altar Servers begins **Wednesday, September 3, at 2:35 PM** in church with Father Louis and the Verdone. It will be each Tuesday during September. And we believe in "on-the-job training," so you may watch the video on our parish website and serve at the weekend Masses so that you may put your training into practice and shadow our existing servers. RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY: We end the Season of Creation with a special time of prayer, with a new holy hour requested first by Pope Francis before he died but not promulgated also by Pope Leo XIV where we have "stations of creation" around our campus, praying for life and specifically God's creation. Here's our schedule on **Sunday, October 5:**

- **Pet Blessing: 12 Noon** around the **Mary statue in front of the Fickel Narthex (center)**
- **Stations of Creation:** Immediately following the blessing of pets, we will process from stop-to-stop (or in Catholic terms – station!) and have specific prayers for creation
- **Rally for Life: 1:00-2:00 PM** on Wilson Mills Road. Our annual announcement to the world with members across the country that we respect all human life from conception to a natural death.

VOCATION COMMITTEE: Our tri-annual meeting to organize our vocation events is coming up **Monday, October 6, 2:45 PM** in the Arkins Room. We always need people for hospitality for our panel guests and folks to help us lead tours. We brainstorm about those we need to share their vocation story, and more! BECOMING CATHOLIC

The three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism – Confirmation – First Communion – are inseparable once a person reaches the age of reason, that is 7 years of age. All three sacraments are placed together and celebrated by the pastor of a parish at the Easter Vigil each year. The Church’s law (Canon Law) requires certain qualifications, rituals and actions in order for this to be celebrated appropriately, especially in line with the National Statutes of the Catechumenate (USA Canon Law). Here is an outline of the session, rituals and steps along the process to become a Catholic Christian if you are 7 years of age (the canonical “age of reason”) or older. **PLACE THESE DATES ON YOUR CALENDAR – MANY ARE MANDATORY** and need special permission from the Bishop to miss or make up.

NOTE: Our PSR and Day School students attend their regular religion classes and come to the Sunday Masses and dismissals for the special formation time each week.

- **Thursday, September 4, 7:00 PM** Opening Session (for adults only): The Secrets of the Church with Father Lane, SSS, and the other team members.
BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!
 - You will also have an overview of the liturgical calendar
 - Held in the Parish Office Parlor (90 minutes with questions from the group)

- **Beginning Sunday, September 14 through April 3:** Sunday Dismissals after the homily and Sunday readings for faith-sharing and information about the faith from the team leaders – at the 10:30 AM Mass each week (except during the three weeks of Lent when noted below)
 - **Both adults and those 7-17 participate** (parents are welcome)
- Sessions for the adults: Thursdays 7:00-8:30 PM **from September 4-May 21** (with breaks for the holidays)
- **Sunday, November 23, 10:30 AM Mass – Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate (with your godparent/sponsor) – Mandatory – PRACTICE at 10:00 AM beforehand**
- **Sunday, February 22, 10:30 AM – Rite of Sending at Saint Paschal Baylon**
 - Followed by lunch, a tour of the Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist, Downtown Cleveland
 - Rite of Election with **Bishop Malesic** at Public Hall – Time to be determined
 - Home by 5:00 PM. It's a day for your godparents/sponsors and you to be together for these special rituals
- **A special ritual for those already baptized – “Rite of Penance”:** Sunday, March 1, 10:30 AM Mass

DURING LENT – YOU WILL BE WITH THE PEOPLE AT THE DIFFERENT MASS TIMES – so that they may pray for and with you, renewing their own covenant:

- **First Scrutiny:** 4:30 PM Mass on **Saturday, March 7**
- **Second Scrutiny:** 8:30 AM Mass on **Sunday, March 15**
- **Third Scrutiny:** 6:30 AM Mass on **Sunday, March 22**

PALM SUNDAY: Sunday, March 29. Attend the 10:30 AM Mass – followed by lunch provided by the parish's Welcome Committee

- Followed by a 12:30 PM Rehearsal for the Easter Vigil

One will be chosen to go to the Chrism Mass (all welcome to retrieve the oil for your Baptism!)

- **Tuesday, March 31, 7:00 PM** Cathedral of Saint John

THE SACRED TRIDUUM

- **Holy Thursday:** Agape Meal at **5:30 PM on Thursday, April 2**, followed by 7:00 PM service
- **Good Friday: Friday, April 3, 7:00 PM** service – and there is a dismissal, but no reflection – you go home to prepare for the next day
- **Easter Vigil: Saturday, April 4, 8:00 PM** – You are at church at 7:30 PM to set up your towel and clothes that you will be changing into after you are baptized (Yes, you will get wet!); you will also be anointed with oil and receive First Communion. Students will also then be able to receive Holy Communion going forward, but especially to be part of the large group celebration on **Sunday, May 3, 2026 at 1:00 PM.**

- **Sunday, May 17, 2026, after the 10:30 AM Mass:** All join a special end-of-the-year picnic – Welcome to candidates for the next season of initiation.

We could not do anything without your generosity. There will be a second collection on this Labor Day weekend, **August 30/31**. This will be our final collection of the year, and the funds received will be used to purchase the food gift cards for Thanksgiving and Christmas so families can buy the food they enjoy. BLOOD DRIVE RESULTS: Many thanks to everyone who participated in our American Red Cross Blood Drive this month. Forty-three participants came forward, including six double-red cell donors. Despite several deferrals and unsuccessful donations, our efforts resulted in the collection of **42 units** of blood, and **\$420.00** in grant money for our school! Our next Blood Drive will be on **Sunday, November 30** (the Sunday after Thanksgiving). We have also scheduled our first 2026 Drive on **March 29**. Hope to see you then!




