Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



**26th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** We continue our reflection in these scriptures from the prophet Amos and the Gospel of Luke this week. Amos reminds us of our duty as God’s people to care for those most in need, especially the poor, and Jesus embodies caring. Dominican Sister Janet Schlichting has an excellent reminder in *Give Us This Day*, September 2019, page 301 that I am paraphrasing here:

God is on the side of the poor, the outcasts, the prostitutes and tax collectors, widows, orphans, lepers, those whose bodies are twisted, and those who cannot see [or hear]. God is for them. God cares about them and wants to gather them in to ease their pain and sorrow.

This leads us to reflect – if we are to be witnesses of God in our world today, how are we on their side, too? ... The question for us is not, “How much do we have?” The key question for us this Sunday is, “How much do we care?”

There is plenty of caring to go around, and we are blessed to be in a community of faith that cares deeply and works on this regularly in our ministries and outreach. We have several pieces to this in our parish’s life, from our Helping Hands Ministry – to NE Ohio, Manna - to our parishioners in need, Social Action Commission and the different facets of education, advocacy, support, through refugee services, Catholic Social Teaching and much more. We care – and want to care more!

**SNOW DAYS?** Due to travel and production schedules, I wrote my column on September 15. Our weekly newsletter *Paschal Life* has more current updates or info and we will even send out an “911” email blast to inform you that the campus is closed due to heat, a water main break or for snow. Or if there is something you just can’t miss, we will write to you! If you do not receive *Paschal Life*, please contact Stephanie at [bulletin@saintpaschal.com](mailto:bulletin@saintpaschal.com) to be on our list, and check your spam folder if you have already been signed up but not seeing it. Recently, we announced something – and a few folks showed up to something that was announced not to be happening. Your group leaders and *Paschal Life* will always try to reach you; help us do that by sharing your email and texting number.

**ANNUAL FINANCE REPORT – WEEK 3 – FINAL REPORT TO YOU** – We have been highlighting, as we do each September, the different aspects of our parish’s life. Your questions and comments over the years have helped us improve our reports. This weekend, our Finance Council is speaking about this to thank you and ask for your continued support, especially for some of us, in challenging times. Our parish groups (i.e. Ladies Guild, Athletic Association, PTO, Helping Hands, Manna, etc.) have their own parish checking accounts under our parish tax-exempt identification number. We have different signers for each organization with me and the clergy, as required. Each group manages their own funds. Otherwise, we have a parish operational account (for your Sunday tithing) and Capital Campaign account, and a maintenance account to always keep your donations as you intend them to serve the parish’s life. We also have an endowment fund for the school that annually allocates 5% of the endowment to our Catholic school and its operational or specific needs at the time of allocation, each May. Currently, our Endowment Fund, invested with the rest of the diocese’s endowments in socially responsible companies, is as of August 31, 2025 at: \$1,384,893.99. Otherwise, here’s our Capital Campaign info:

  - Capital Campaign donations 2025: \$394,245.02
  - Anonymous OBH pledge/ donation Christmas 2025: \$600,000.00**\$1,812,928.01**
- **EXPENSES:**
  - Fundraising Company, postage & printing: \$117,540.31
  - StudioTechne Architects \$36,528.27
  - Capital Campaign Dinners (most donated) \$93.91
  - Warren Roofing (FLC) – *there will be one more final invoice* \$500,220.00**\$654,382.49**

**HOW WILL YOU HONOR FATHER O'BRIEN AND THE BLESSED SACRAMENT TODAY?** Won't you contribute to the Capital Campaign to expand the kitchen and replace the 54-year-old equipment? Would you help with our elder SSS in their health care? How about helping replace the 70-year-old bathrooms in the Early Childhood Wing? These needs will help our facilities grow for the next 72 years! **The architects have given us cost of this part of the renovation for \$700,000! Thank you for donating!**

And also know that our parish’s operational fund has been underfunded for the year so far! If you are able to increase your tithing, please do so!

I am quite grateful to the Confirmation Catechists who share their faith once a month with our students. Our students are in PSR and our Catholic Day School. ### TWO MORE NEEDED – GOT IDEAS FOR THE PARISH?

Unfortunately, we begin our Pastoral Council year with two less folks on the council. Help the parish grow and get better! Please let me know if you can join us for our pastoral planning, once a month, and a chance for us to regularly evaluate and improve the parish's life. I also can share with you our Pastoral Council guidelines to help you decide if God is calling you to serve our parish in this way.

**THIS WEEK:** We will have a special **Eucharistic Holy Hour with Martyr Ursuline Sister Dorothy K on Tuesday, September 30 at 7:00 PM** in church. There will be a special reflection by a fellow Ursuline Sister Cheryl Mentkowski and scripture reflections on the acting with God's justice in our world. This will be hosted by the Social Action Commission. Our Children's Choir will be singing Sunday for the Respect Life Mass, too. Next Sunday, remember, we end the Season of Creation with a special time of prayer, with a new holy hour requested first by Pope Francis before he died, but not promulgated also by Pope Leo XIV where we have "stations of creation" around our campus, praying for life and specifically God's creation. Here's our schedule on **Sunday, October 5:**

- **Pet Blessing: 12 Noon** around the **Mary statue in front of the Fickel Narthex (center)**
- **Stations of Creation:** immediately following the Blessing of Pets, we will process from stop to stop (or in Catholic terms – station!) and have specific prayer for creation
- **Rally for Life: 1:00-2:00 PM** on Wilson Mills Road. Our annual announcement to the world that we respect all human life from conception to a natural death with members across the country.

**VOCATION COMMITTEE:** Our tri-annual meeting to organize our vocation events is coming up **Monday, October 6, 2:45PM in the Arkins Room**. We always need people of hospitality for our panel guests and folks to help us lead tours. We brainstorm about those we need to share their vocation story, and more! 

## BECOMING CATHOLIC

The three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism – Confirmation – First Communion – are inseparable once a person reaches the age of reason, that is 7 years of age. All three sacraments are placed together and celebrated by the pastor of a parish at the Easter Vigil each year. The church’s law (Canon Law) requires certain qualifications, rituals and actions in order for this to be celebrated appropriately, especially in line with the National Statutes of the Catechumenate (USA Canon Law). Here is an outline of the session, rituals and steps along the process to become a Catholic Christian if you are 7 years of age (the canonical “age of reason”) or older. **PLACE THESE DATES ON YOUR CALENDAR – MANY ARE MANDATORY** and need special permission from the bishop to miss or make up.

**NOTE:** Our PSR and Day School students attend their regular religion classes and come to the Sunday Masses and dismissals for the special formation time each week.


- **Began Sunday, September 14, through April 3:** Sunday Dismissals after the homily and Sunday readings for faith sharing and information about the faith from the team leaders - at the 10:30 AM Mass each week (except during the three weeks of Lent when noted below)
  - **Both adults and those 7-17 participate** (parents are welcome)
- Sessions for the adults: Following **Thursdays 7:00-8:30 PM through May 21** (with breaks for the holidays)
- **Sunday, November 23, 10:30 AM Mass – Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate (with your godparent/sponsor) – Mandatory – PRACTICE at 10:00 AM before hand**



- **February 22, 10:30 AM** – Rite of Sending at Saint Paschal Baylon
  - Followed by lunch, a tour of the Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist, Downtown Cleveland
  - Rite of Election with **Bishop Malesic** at Public Hall – Time to be determined
  - Home by 5:00 pm. It's a day for your godparents/sponsors and you to be together for these special rituals
- **A special ritual for those already baptized – "Rite of Penance:" Sunday, March 1, 10:30 AM Mass**

*DURING LENT - YOU WILL BE WITH THE PEOPLE AT THE DIFFERENT MASS TIMES – so that they may pray for and with you, renewing their own covenant:*

- **First Scrutiny:** 4:30 PM Mass on **Saturday, March 7**
- **Second Scrutiny:** 8:30 AM Mass on **Sunday, March 15**
- **Third Scrutiny:** 6:30 AM Mass on **Sunday, March 22**
- **Palm Sunday: Sunday, March 29** Attend the 10:30 AM Mass
  - followed by lunch provided by the parish's Welcome Committee
  - followed by a 12:30 PM Rehearsal for the Easter Vigil



**One will be chosen to go to the Chrism Mass (all welcome to retrieve the oil for your Baptism!)**

- **Tuesday, March 31, 7:00 PM** Cathedral of Saint John

## THE SACRED TRIDUUM

- **Holy Thursday:** Agape Meal at 5:30 PM on **Thursday, April 2**, followed by 7:00 PM service
- **Good Friday: Friday, April 3, 7:00 PM** service – and there is a dismissal but no reflection – you go home to prepare for the next day
- **Easter Vigil: Saturday, April 4, 8:00 PM** – you are at church at 7:30 PM to set up your towel and clothes that you will be changing into after you are baptized (yes, you get wet!); you will also be anointed with oil and receive First Communion. Students will also be then able to receive Holy Communion going forward, but especially be part of the large group celebration on **Sunday, May 3, 2026 at 1:00 PM.**
- **Sunday, May 17, 2026 after the 10:30 AM Mass:** All join a special end-of-the-year picnic – welcome to candidates for the next season on initiation.

What did Jesus wear?

Scripture does not give a consistent description of Jesus, but we catch glimpses from the Gospels. Mark says he wore a mantle or large shawl. Matthew, Mark, and John imply that he wore sandals, and we know what ancient Judean sandals were like because they have been preserved in dry caves by the Dead Sea. He wore a tunic that men at the time wore just slightly below the knees, not at the ankles. And Jesus' tunic was one-piece and not the customary two piece, as attested by the Gospel of John during Christ's passion. One-piece tunics were basically undergarments. Hardly fashionable but certainly basic.

I pose this question because in today's Gospel, Jesus shares his Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, a story so well known to us Christians that we might take it for granted. We need to listen to it with fresh ears and an open mind.

The contrast between the two main characters could not be greater: the rich man dressed in the finest clothes and ate lavishly. The poor man was hungry, covered in sores, and lived with dogs. Interestingly, he has a name and is the only parable character upon whom Jesus bestows a name: Lazarus, El-Azar, which means "God Has Helped." This is a powerful reminder to us that no poor person is invisible to God. The rich man knew of Lazarus, who was lying at his door; but he ignored the poor man even as he dined sumptuously. He had to eventually answer for ignoring the poor. When the two men died and entered eternity, it was the rich man who begged that Lazarus bestow mercy upon *him*.

Jesus' message is simple: Be alert to the needs of those who are so easy to ignore. Without an eye for the needy around us, our lives become empty and self-centered. – Ken Canedo


