Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle (“adoration”). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the “4-ends” of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

## A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



**28th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** Many of you know that this weekend in Canada they are celebrating Thanksgiving. They are lucky that the readings today remind us of this gift, the purpose of who we are as Christians, and what our life is meant to be: thanksgiving = Eucharist. Have you ever had the experience of the least expected person coming to you to offer you gratitude or thanks? In those circumstances, the experience of gratitude meant so much more. Not only that, I felt a healing power of grace that comes from offering thanks and recognizing the gifts and giftedness of God and others. With our Thanksgiving in over a month, we tend to use this time of year to offer thanks. But could we also remember that this is why we come to Mass? We come to give God thanks first! We go as often as we can to Mass to “give thanks” and not **get something out of it**. Thanksgiving is about offering, not “getting” or having to receive something in return. But doesn’t God ALWAYS GIVE SOMETHING TO US? At every Mass, in every day of our life, God *gives!* And in our giving thanks to God, no matter the priest, homily, music, people around us, it’s about God and us saying, “thanks” to God because we are so blessed. So, no matter what country we are in, no matter what happens in our life, the attitude of gratitude is prime for us in our relationships. Offering thanks helps us offer ourselves – and this heals us and the divisions that help us do good. May we always be a thankful people!



### FOUR MORE NEEDED – GOT IDEAS FOR THE PARISH?

Unfortunately, we begin our Pastoral Council year with two less folks on the council. Help the parish grow and get better! We need hard working folks to have a vision for a better church – our church and the greater church. Please let me know if you can join us for our pastoral planning, once a month, and a chance for us to regularly evaluate and improve the parish’s life. I also can share with you our Pastoral Council guidelines to help you decide if God is calling you to serve our parish in this way. **NOT ONLY THAT....** Our Finance Council recently had two members who had to leave their office on this council, required by Canon (church) Law. Share your financial abilities and duties to serve your parish and its many ministries. As you saw last month, a large portion of our budget is our largest ministry – our Catholic school. We could use your help!

**PASTORAL COUNCIL – PASTORAL PLANNING:** Where do you wish for our parish to grow in the future? How can we add pieces to our planning? What’s a suggestion or two you have to help grow our parish? **QUESTIONS FROM LEADERSHIP KNIGHT AND SUGGESTION BOX:** We appreciate how folks drop questions or comments (and even donations) in our suggestion box. In review of our Leadership Knight process, there were some particular questions:

- **What happened to our Advancement/Development Director? Do we have one now?** We do not have a person in this position. The existing Pastoral Staff members, along with Stephanie Kess in the school’s scholarship office position, all take a piece of this area and promote the advancement of the parish, and importantly, our Catholic school. Back in October 2019, we were faced with a deficit of \$250,000. Not only that, COVID occurred and donations tanked for 6 months, starting in January. Yes, even then, folks did not come to Mass before the virus took hold. If you recall, we also had a blizzard at Christmas 2019 and suffered a tremendous loss of tithing and revenue. Based on this, we knew we were faced with having to cut costs and that was mostly in salaries and benefits. After COVID and the PPP grant package, we were able to bring most of our Pastoral Staff to their renewed positions, since we shift many roles. However, we still have not returned three key positions between Pastoral Staff and maintenance to be able to live the realities of our current budget experience. This is also why many key hopes and dreams from the 2020 – 2025 Pastoral Plan were not implemented since we do not have an Evangelization Director or other personnel who had that in their role.
- **Who reaches out to colleges and Newman Centers? Who does Theology on Tap?** Through our youth minister, we keep connected to our students; being that she is part-time, there are no other ways she is able to do this outreach. We invite everyone to make an effort to invite and include and share the great stories of the need for young people to get involved and lead our parish. All the baptized have a role in making our parish better and more inclusive.

- Does the Welcoming Committee send out new parishioners' lists, packets and invitations to join our parish? Can we reinstate the "New Parishioner Welcome Brunch?" Yes, our committee does do these regular events. And they will read your suggestion about the brunch and work on this again, too!
- Can babysitting be provided for Spiritual Formation Groups and their small group sessions? It could be if we knew the need and we could request some of our youth or young babysitters to be available.

**LITURGICAL NOTES:** Last year, you may recall that for the first time, we invited folks to bring photos of those who had died in the past year and others special to our lives. We will continue this practice again, for the "Altar of the Dead" by having a table in the place of honor in church. (This is where we place statues and sometimes crosses and the Advent wreath. Bring your items to the piano area by October 26 so that we may place them for you on this special table, beginning for the Holy Hour on October 29. This Eucharistic Holy Hour mentions ALL those who died in the past year and names placed on the banners in the sanctuary.



There are some key notes about events coming. This is meant to be informative and invitational. Did you know that this year, November 1 is a holy day – but **just not** of an obligation? This is why many parishes will not offer a Vigil Mass (on October 31). We will have two Masses to keep the day holy and invite you to participate at either **9:00 AM or 12:15 PM**.

- Also on All Saints Day, Saturday, November 1 – please note the church opens at 6:00 AM. We also have Morning Prayer at 8:00 AM for the Solemnity and the Rosary at 8:30 AM.
- Sunday, **November 2** is the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). The Gloria is not sung, but the Creed is proclaimed.
- The month of November, especially All Souls' Day, is a traditional time for visiting graves of loved ones, as is the anniversary of death. The "Order for Visiting a Cemetery," (see *Book of Blessings* 1734-1754) may be used by a priest, deacon, lay minister, or a family, either immediately following Mass or apart from Mass.

- **November 16** is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In his Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia et Misera*, Pope Francis designated this day "World Day of the Poor." It is suggested that, beginning tomorrow, the days before Thanksgiving be set aside for deeds of charity, of penance, and for prayers for economic justice.

**REMEMBERING THE SSS AT REGINA:** Our last 125th Anniversary Celebration of the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) in the USA for Northeast Ohio is at Regina Health Center, **Sunday, November 9, 11:00 AM** in their Holy Family Chapel. Please let Scott Gongos [sgongos@blesseedsacrament.com](mailto:sgongos@blesseedsacrament.com) know if you are coming and being part of the special luncheon reception – and we will honor those SSS who died at Regina since it was started in 1993.


