Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle (“adoration”). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the “4-ends” of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today, the Church also celebrates World Mission Sunday. This is a chance for us, especially through today's second collection, to support missionaries worldwide. You have been so generous in supporting our SSS missions, especially this year in Sri Lanka. Today's readings remind us how we support one another, literally holding up one another to build them up and help them learn the faith. Through teaching the sacred mysteries, building places for worship and catechesis, we help large parishes throughout the world grow and find the support they need. As you know, too, I have been blessed to go to some of these communities and see how our "gifts and stewardship" support them in their needs: a place for the church to grow. Just as Europe built the USA church, we are grateful now for us to have this opportunity, too.

PASTORAL COUNCIL – PASTORAL PLANNING: Where do you wish for our parish to grow in the future? How can we add pieces to our planning? What's a suggestion or two you have to help grow our parish? Jot down an idea or two and send them via email to Jack Kristofco at orchard721@gmail.com, chair of the Pastoral Planning subcommittee of the Pastoral Council or to me. Next week, **Monday, October 27**, we will have our meeting to discuss your thoughts and dreams. **STILL NEED ONE MORE PERSON TO JOIN PASTORAL COUNCIL!** Come and see!

QUESTIONS FROM LEADERSHIP KNIGHT AND SUGGESTION BOX: We appreciate how folks drop questions or comments (and even donations) in our suggestion box. In review our Leadership Knight process, there were some particular questions:

- **Why don't we have altar servers now? Can't they get service hours?** 8th graders do "get service hours" by being an altar server. Many of our youth are overcommitted with sports and they and their families do not worship at our church on the weekends. We also hope, like at other parishes, that the youth will serve in high school and college. However, they do not.....

- **Is there a database with people's skills?** When folks register, they have this option to fill in on the form. Most do; a few do not. In actuality, many people do not request other parishioners' services unless they advertise on the bulletin back cover.
- **Could parish organizations offer "coffee and donuts" regularly? They would serve and folks could learn about their ministry.** From your question to God's ears, well, the parish groups. We have always tried to promote this ministry after Mass. I hope that our wonderful groups see your suggestion and will take it upon themselves to assist us with this wonderful hospitality.
- **Why isn't there a marketing committee anymore?** The folks who were on this committee phased off due to their family commitments. We are always happy to have other folks come forward to support a committee for this purpose; it was a subcommittee of the Finance Council. We count on our parishioners to be the marketing committee: "How do you know someone goes to/likes Saint Paschal Baylon? They tell you!"

LITURGICAL NOTES: Last year, you may recall that for the first time, we invited folks to bring photos of those who had died in the past year and others special to our lives. We will continue this practice again, for the "Altar of the Dead" by having a table in the place of honor in church. (This is where we place statues and sometimes crosses and the Advent wreath.) Bring your items to the piano area by October 26 so that we may place them for you on this special table, beginning for the Holy Hour on **October 29**. This Eucharistic Holy Hour mentions ALL those who died in the past year and names placed on the banners in the sanctuary.

There are some key notes about events coming. This is meant to be informative and invitational. Did you know that *this year*, November 1 is a holy day – but **just not** of an obligation? This is why many parishes will not offer a Vigil Mass (on October 31). We will have *two* Masses to keep the day holy and invite you to participate at either **9:00 AM OR 12:15 PM**.

- Also on All Saints Day, **Saturday, November 1** – please note the church opens at 6:00 AM. We also have Morning Prayer at 8:00 AM for the Solemnity and the Rosary at 8:30 AM.
- **Sunday, November 2** is the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). The Gloria is not sung, but the Creed is proclaimed.
- The month of November, especially All Souls' Day, is a traditional time for visiting graves of loved ones, as is the anniversary of death. The "Order for Visiting a Cemetery," (see *Book of Blessings* 1734-1754) may be used by a priest, deacon, lay minister, or a family, either immediately following Mass or apart from Mass.
- **November 16** is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In his Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia et Misera*, Pope Francis designated this day "World Day of the Poor." It is suggested that, beginning tomorrow, the days before Thanksgiving be set aside for deeds of charity, of penance, and for prayers for economic justice.

REMEMBERING THE SSS AT REGINA: Our last 125th Anniversary Celebration of the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) in the USA for Northeast Ohio is at Regina Health Center, **Sunday, November 9, 11:00 AM** in their Holy Family Chapel. Please let Scott Gongos at sgongos@blessedsacrament.com know if you are coming and being part of the special luncheon reception – and we will honor those SSS who died at Regina since it was started in 1993.

- It's time to start looking for your Advent candles since the colors are hard to find! A family may use any color combination, for it is not specified the color in the *Book of Blessings*. Traditionally, folks use violet (which can hue bluer) and rose (which can hue pink).
- **First Sunday of Advent:** Begins with the Holy Vigil Mass on Saturday, November 29, 4:30 PM – Blessing of the Advent Wreath and Jesse Tree. Something you can do at home, too!
- **Let's Go to Confession!** – Saturdays at 3:30 PM – Rite 1 – Individual. **Penance Services (Rite 2 – communal some song and readings from the liturgical rite, with individual confessions):**


