Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle (“adoration”). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the “4-ends” of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

## A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



**30th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** Do you know someone who is always right? Or has to be? Is it even ourselves? While today's Gospel focuses on righteousness and praying, it also serves as an opportunity for important self-discovery about our need to be "down to earth," or humble. Before God, we can be very humble, but due to pride, a culture that values being right over being compassionate and mutually building up each other up, we have righteous people always preaching "their way or the highway." Many leaders, as Jesus was trying to point out in His parable, were not modeling humility or asking for apologies. How many folks do you know who offer an apology? So many make excuses or just blame everyone else, no?

Our Penitential Rite of Mass sets the tone for us at each Mass to think of ourselves and those who we have neglected on purpose or just from not thinking about them, especially the poor. We begin asking God and one another for forgiveness. (We only strike our breast once!) We need God and more humility in our lives; the Eucharist brings this to the forefront at each Mass so that we are open to hearing and learning from God's Word every day.

We are all growing together on the journey – and this Sunday's readings remind us we still have a way to go. Let's finish the race together (see Tim 4: 6–8, 16–18).

**COUNCILS NOW FILLED WITH GREAT LEADERS:** I thank Chuck and Brian for Finance Council and Dave and Dawn for the Pastoral Council for sharing their gifts with us after reading the bulletin, praying about it and joining in service to our parish. I appreciate them and all who lend their voice to assist the parish's life, including the other key leaders' groups with the Liturgy Commission and School Advisory Council.

**HONORING OUR DEAD:** Last year, you may recall that for the first time we invited folks to bring photos of those who had died in the past year and others special to our lives. We will continue this practice again, for the "Altar of the Dead" by having a table in the place of honor in church. This is where we place statues and sometimes crosses and the Advent wreath. Bring your items to the piano area by the end of today so that we may place them for you on this special table, for the Holy Hour on Wednesday, **October 29**. This Eucharistic Holy Hour mentions ALL those who died in the past year and names placed on the banners in the sanctuary. **See you Wednesday night at 7:00 PM.**

There are some key notes about events coming. This is meant to be informative and invitational. Did you know that *this year*, **November 1** is a Holy Day – but **just not** of an obligation? This is why many parishes will not offer a Vigil Mass (on October 31). We will have *two* Masses to keep the day holy and invite you to participate at either **9:00 AM or 12:15 PM.**

- Also, **THIS WEEK, IS All Saints Day, Saturday, November 1** – please note the church opens at 6:00 AM. We also have Morning Prayer at 8:00 AM for the Solemnity and the Rosary at 8:30 AM.
- **Sunday, November 2 is the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day).** The Gloria is not sung, but the Creed is proclaimed. We will remember those who died and are commemorated on the banners in the sanctuary.
- The month of November, especially All Souls' Day, is a traditional time for visiting graves of loved ones, as is the Anniversary of Death. The "Order for Visiting a Cemetery," (see *Book of Blessings* 1734-1754) may be used by a priest, deacon, lay minister, or a family, either immediately following Mass or apart from Mass.
- **November 16 is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time.** In his Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia et Misera*, Pope Francis designated this day "World Day of the Poor." It is suggested that, beginning tomorrow, the days before Thanksgiving be set aside for deeds of charity, of penance, and for prayers for economic justice.



**REMEMBERING THE SSS AT REGINA:** Our last 125th Anniversary Celebration of the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) in the USA for Northeast Ohio is at Regina Health Center, **Sunday, November 9, 11:00 AM in their Holy Family Chapel.** Please let Scott Gongos at [sgongos@blessedsacrament.com](mailto:sgongos@blessedsacrament.com) know if you are coming and being part of the special luncheon reception – and we will honor those SSS who died at Regina since it was started in 1993.

**PREPARING FOR ADVENT** – It's time to finalize our Advent plans together! Time for purchase of our Advent Candles, calendars, wreath and such to keep the sacred day and times holy for us. Our theme is "Jesus Christ, Hope for the World," with our theme song for the event, the famous song we sing a lot of times at Communion.

Here are some other important items to note:

- **#weGiveCatholic on December 2:** It's our 24 hours of giving to our parish – and through our Catholic school, we will get more tables for the cafeteria – O'Brien Hall. Each table costs \$2,100.00.
- **ADVENT LESSONS & CAROL:** Thanks to our Music & Liturgy Director, Roberta Modica, we will have this Advent custom return to SPB this **Wednesday, December 17, 7:00 PM** in church with all our musicians (singers and instrumentalists). **Thanks for placing this event on your calendar for some prayer, celebration and fun in the midst of Advent.**

**OUR EVANGELIZING:** Twenty-five years of surveys in the Catholic Church and other institutes have asked this question, "Why did you come back to Mass?" The number one reason...*"because someone invited me!"* Let's do this for November and share with them the gift of healing and Eucharist. What if I told you that most are waiting to be invited home and that inviting them doesn't have to be difficult. No judgement for you to them – ride sharing or something as an incentive like a meal afterward. We are excited to announce a simple yet effective tool that doesn't cost you a dime – but is so helpful for bringing people back to practicing their faith.




