Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle (“adoration”). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the “4-ends” of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

## A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



**THE COMMEMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED:** This weekend, we honor our beloved dead from SPB. We will hear the names read of the 59 women and men of faith who lived, moved and had their being here at SPB and we memorialize them. We are grateful for their witness of faith; they ate the Bread of Life and shared in the Cup of Blessing. They remind us how we, too, live our faith in hope and love, being faithful stewards of God's many gifts and blessings. We remember how they loved us; we remember that each Eucharist around the table of the Lord unites the heavenly banquet to us. Our taste of our future supports us in our loss of them and sustains us for our journey to the new eternal Jerusalem. We join in the chorus of angels and martyrs who celebrate their arrival and sing: Alleluia!

**HONORING OUR DEAD:** The photo you see with my column is from our twice-a-year Bereavement Mass. During the month of November, we traditionally honor all the dead and make a special visit to the cemetery for our loved one to unite in prayer with them; please consider saying this prayer from the *Catholic Household Blessings & Prayers*, page 159, "Visiting a Grave." After reciting the Lord's Prayer together, (and you may also pray a "Hail! Mary" and "Glory Be," or other litanies from this family prayer book, say).

*Lord God, whose days are without end and whose mercies beyond counting, keep us mindful that life is short and the hour of death unknown. Let your Spirit guide our days on earth in the ways of holiness and justice, that we may serve You in union with the whole Church, sure in faith, strong in hope, perfected in love. And when our early journey is ended, lead us rejoicing into Your [heavenly home,] where You live forever and ever.*

### HELP WITH THE ADVENT WREATH AT MASS & PREPARE:

It's time to finalize our Advent plans together! Time to purchase our Advent Candles, calendars, wreaths and such to keep the sacred day and times holy for us. (Great Advent Calendars at the big box store next to 271!) Our theme is "Jesus Christ, Hope for the World," with our theme song for the event, the famous song we sing a lot of times at Communion.

For the Advent Wreath, we keep our tradition of needing folks to assist, or if you wish, if the Mass is for your family, please let the priest know, even a week ahead of time. Here's what we do:

- Before Mass, the priest and/or George (depending on the Mass time) recruit a parish family to light the candles on the wreath.
- On the First week of Advent after the homily, the priest invites the family forward during the Creed to come into the sanctuary to light the candle.
- During the last prayer of the Universal Prayers, the "Blessing of the Advent Wreath" is recited.
- After the prayer, the family lights the candle and all sing "Rejoice, Rejoice..." from "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."
- On the next three Sundays, the family lights the candle during the Opening Procession and Song. The priest has the family go before him; they go to the Advent Wreath and light the candle while we are singing the Opening Song. The family comes down next to the priest and they bow together in reverence to the altar.
- A family can request to light the wreath, or one is chosen, usually by a priest, and they process into the church with the priest and altar servers at the beginning of Mass. Those who volunteer ahead of time are listed on the bulletin board in the vesting sacristy.
- Please note – there is no *Gloria* during Advent, so don't be late for Mass and especially the readings.

Here are some other important items to note:

- **ADVENT HOLY HOUR:** Monday, December 1, 6:30 PM in church. (NOTE THE SPECIAL TIME so that the PSR Parents may join us as well as everyone else.)
- **ADVENT GIVING TREE:** During this holy season of giving, we will have the Helping Hands Advent Giving Tree in the Fickel Narthex for your support of a houseless family or another family in one of the other residences across NE Ohio.

- **#weGiveCatholic on December 2:** It's our 24 hours of giving to our parish – and through our Catholic school, we will get more tables for the cafeteria – O'Brien Hall. Each table costs \$2,150.00.
- **ADVENT LESSONS & CAROL:** Thanks to our Music & Liturgy Director, Roberta Modica, we will have this Advent custom return to SPB on **Wednesday, December 17, 7:00 PM** in church with all our musicians (singers and instrumentalists). **Thanks for placing this event on your calendar for some prayer, celebration and fun in the midst of Advent.**

### PRAYER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:

Also for Advent, we are adding times of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament besides Thursdays. Like during Lent last year, we will have an hour of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after **EACH WEEKDAY 9:00 AM Mass**. When the priest processes to the chapel from the church, follow him.


Also – from 7:30-8:15 AM, which means during Morning Prayer that starts at 8:00 AM, we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with members of the SSS. Join us for these additional hours of praying with the Eucharist in Adoration, thanksgiving, petition and forgiveness.

**OUR EVANGELIZING:** Twenty-five years of surveys in the Catholic Church and other institutes have asked this question, "Why did you come back to Mass?" The number one reason... "*because someone invited me!*" Let's do this for November and share with them the gift of healing and the Eucharist. What if I told you that most are waiting to be invited home and that inviting them doesn't have to be difficult. No judgement for you to them – ride sharing or something as an incentive like a meal afterward. We are excited to announce a simple yet effective tool that doesn't cost you a dime – but is so helpful for bringing people back to practicing their faith.

**OUR PHOTOS:** We appreciate all our Bible Studies, join Agape on Tuesday mornings at 9:30 AM in the Kazel Room. We had a great "indoor" Trunk-or-Treat this year – and we are so grateful to the Youth Group and Evamarie Cross for leading it.

*We are grateful for your stewardship and care!* A special note about one of our stewards, my mom, Jo Ann Lane. I have always been so proud of my mom, who, with my dad, taught me how to be a steward. Three women in the parish listened to the invitation of the new parochial vicar, Father Bill Murtaugh, SSS, to break down a barrier and become the first female lectors in the parish in 1973. Mom, Colletta Bonnett and Jean Glouster (with these two women dying a few years back) said "yes" to the call when only men were allowed to read at Mass. After 52 years of sharing and proclaiming God's word, my mom is stepping back from regular proclamation of the Sunday Scriptures and not assigning "team one" anymore. Thank you, Mom, for blazing a trail and inspiring us all to love God's word! Let us continue to pray for each other, and, as Bishop Malesic says, "serve the Lord with gladness." Looking forward to supporting our Catholic school at the 8th Gala next week: sell those raffle tickets, with extra ones at the offices.




