Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle (“adoration”). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the “4-ends” of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA IN

ROME: The Catholic Church loves celebrating the anniversary of our buildings! They represent people, just as Christ alluded to in today's Gospel, and also in the first reading from Exodus and Psalm 46. We love the poetic language of being a temple, a foundation, and as Paul says to the Corinthians: being God's building. God dwells in each one of us and when the People of God gather, we are building. But doesn't weather have a factor? So, we have made special dedicated spaces for us to gather and be the dwelling of God in a physical space for the dwelling of God. Today marks the oldest and first cathedral in Christendom's history. On this anniversary day, we realize how these buildings and people of faith unite us into a living church where the Holy Spirit and the water of life flow through each one of us. Every 6 or 7 years, we celebrate this day on a Sunday to mark its importance and the importance we each have to being present as Church. We appreciate you being Church with us and bringing more and more people to be, Church. Who have you invited lately?

And, when I preach, I'll give a tad of a history lesson on this special day in our Catholic history and the naming of this basilica.

THIS WEEK'S PICS: One of my favorite pictures of the summer was our Bible Camp and annual picture in front of the church. It was a perfect day as you can see by the photo: perfect because we celebrate the fact that we are Church with our "lighthouse-tent" church: the Body of Christ learning our faith. Eleven-month-old Matteo Giovanni Abraham was baptized on October 25. Our Cub Scouts celebrated Halloween in OBH. I remembered a picture of me in the Cathedral of Saint John Lateran when I did a pilgrimage with my parish in 2009, still in Albuquerque before joining with you all here.

PASTORAL COUNCIL DISCUSSION: On October 27, we had our regular council meeting with our new members on board. Due to production schedules, for my column is written almost two weeks in advance, I was not able to thank Linda Citraro for joining; she filled the last slot just in time for the meeting, but not on time for the bulletin deadline for me. Thank you for serving your parish again, Linda, in this role of pastoral planning and vision.

We had two key aspects to our meeting. First hearing reports from our Catechetical Leader Anna Peko (and her husband George for his support and hard work and dedication), Youth Minister Evamarie Cross and new Parish Administrator Stephanie Evans (assisting the pastor and staff in leading and serving the major duties or organization of the parish). We are grateful to them for their excellent ministry leadership. Each took a moment to share current statistics and programs. As part of our pastoral planning process for a new vision statement for 2026-2030, we asked their thoughts for the future needs of the program. One key note for now: **We need some adults to help support our youth ministry with the large amounts of youth attending.**

Another key discussion: **A safety officer for weekend Masses.** To hire someone, it would be a \$40,000.00 weekend expense for our 26-acre campus. We always have the Highland Heights Police Department at the ready, whether tuned in watching our 76-camera system or 911. Being lighter with their issues on the weekend, both the police and fire are here within seconds if there is an issue, for many a time we have had a fainting parishioner and as we have seen, they are here quickly once one of the ushers or other parishioners' calls for assistance. **YES, we all have the permission to dial 911.** (And folks always do! It's just question folks ask me.) We are all concerned about safety. We discussed when is it enough, how do we deal with our fears, how do we trust, and many additional issues. We will ask the ushers to be separated at each door and have additional training about this concern. This is an ongoing concern, one as a Catholic school we have addressed with our existing safety officer, facilities director and an additional HHPD officer (when possible) to be present for a student Mass. (We also have locked all the doors except the Fickel Narthex to limit entry.) Let's keep talking about it, but for now, this position is NOT in our budget for this current physical year, and in fact, our tithing is behind and stretched with folks dealing with inflation.

QUESTIONS FROM THE MEETING: Another favorite feature of the Pastoral Council Meeting is the suggestion box. Sometimes it's just sharing info. For instance, on the listening devices, they are a great tool, but not adjustable to your ear size. We hope your hearing aid will adjust to the signal. When the green light above the sacristy is on, you know the system is on for your convenience. Other questions:

- **Why is the tabernacle candle blue and not red like it should be?** Our tabernacle is a unique and award-winning piece of art, designed and built by our own Brother Gary LaVerdiere, SSS, and recently refurbished by George Zagar. The fixture holder is its own piece of art that holds a special size of designer glass. When Father Mario designed and built the chapel in the church, he also dedicated it to Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament. So, the stained-glass ceiling and chairs are also blue in dedication to our Blessed Mother. We all love Mary, don't we?

6:30 SUNDAY: WE NEED YOUR HELP! This Mass has grown in participation; we need additional Communion Ministers, lectors and ushers. On October 19, we had our largest crowd at this Mass since COVID, but only 4 Communion Ministers. It's not that we want to rush, but it assists and facilitates things for the ritual and also allows for more folks to share their baptismal service. We also appreciate the youth coming forward to usher too!

REMEMBERING THE SSS AT REGINA: I'll miss the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass this Sunday due to our last 125th Anniversary Celebration of the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) in the USA for Northeast Ohio at Regina Health Center. We celebrate the past with the 50 men who have lived at Regina and shared their ministry of praying for us from there. Thanks for your contributions to support our mission for the next 125 years, especially.

HELP WITH THE ADVENT WREATH AT MASS & PREPARE:

It's time to finalize our Advent plans together! Time to purchase our Advent Candles, calendars, wreath and such to keep the sacred day and times holy for us. (Great Advent Calendars at the big box store next to 271!) Our theme is "Jesus Christ, Hope for the World," with our theme song for the event, the famous song we sing a lot of times at Communion.

For the Advent Wreath, we keep our tradition of needing folks to assist, or if you wish, if the Mass is for your family, please let the priest know, even a week ahead of time. Here's what we do:

- Before Mass, the priest and/or George (depending on the Mass time) recruit a parish family to light the wreath.
- On the First week of Advent after the homily, the priest invites the family forward during the Creed to come into the sanctuary to light the candle.
- During the last prayer of the Universal Prayers, the "Blessing of the Advent Wreath" is recited.
- After the prayer, the family lights the candle and all sing "Rejoice, Rejoice..." from "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."
- On the next three Sundays, the family lights the candle during the Opening Procession and Song. The priest has the family go before him; they go to the Advent Wreath and light the candle while we are singing the Opening Song. The family comes down next to the priest and they bow together in reverence to the altar.
- A family can request to light the wreath, or one is chosen, usually by a priest, and they process into the church with the priest and altar servers at the beginning of Mass. Those who volunteer ahead of time are listed on the bulletin board in the vesting sacristy.
- Please note – there is no *Gloria* during Advent, so don't be late for Mass and especially the readings.

Here are some other important items to note:

- **ADVENT RETREAT KNIGHT:** A "Yes" That Brings Us Christmas. Tuesday, December 2, 6:00 PM in church with guest speaker Sr. Rita Schroeder, SND.
- **#weGiveCatholic on December 2:** It's our 24 hours of giving to our parish – and through our Catholic school, we will get more tables for the cafeteria – O'Brien Hall. Each table costs \$2,150.00.
- **ADVENT LESSONS & CAROL:** Thanks to our Music & Liturgy Director, Roberta Modica, we will have this Advent custom return to SPB on Wednesday, December 17, 7:00 PM in church with all our musicians (singers and instrumentalists). **Thanks for placing this event on your calendar for some prayer, celebration and fun in the midst of Advent.**

Also, for Advent, we are adding times of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament besides Thursdays. Like during Lent last year, we will have an hour of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after EACH WEEKDAY 9:00 AM Mass. When the priest processes to the chapel from the church, follow him.

Also – from 7:30-8:15 AM, which means during Morning Prayer that starts at 8:00 AM, we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with members of the SSS. Join us for these additional hours of praying with the Eucharist in adoration, thanksgiving, petition and forgiveness.

We are grateful for your stewardship and care! Let us continue to pray for each other, and, as Bishop Malesic says, "serve the Lord with gladness." Looking forward to supporting our Catholic school at the 8th Gala this Friday, November 14. Sell those raffle tickets, with extra ones at the offices.

SPB SCHOOL NEWS




