Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

33rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Being the last sequential reading from the Gospel of Luke, in this Year C liturgical year quickly coming to an end, we hear Christ giving us a lot of future talking about Himself and the temple. Structures come and go, as we see with the buildings of our own time and around NE Ohio, but yet faith, hope and love and our service to these virtues are called to endure any trial in our lives. Paul reminds the Thessalonians to keep active in their service, to not hoard other people's things, especially their food, and realize our purpose as Christian disciples. May we see our role in bringing a certain fire from the Holy Spirit to the service and care we do in bringing joy to the Body of Christ.

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR – SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 16: As you know, the Universal Church will be celebrating the Ninth Annual **World Day of the Poor on Sunday, November 16**. In many dioceses there will be a collection for the Campaign for Human Development.

MORE FROM OUR PASTORAL COUNCIL SUGGESTION BOX:

This was addressed before but I remind folks **why we have announcements after Mass** – to remind or raise awareness. In our busy worlds, not everyone has the time to read the bulletin. I am so impressed that so many DO read our bulletin. However, our parish organizations work hard and wish for these reminders. We are being kind, considerate and serving to alert folks to something important in our parish's life.

- **Can we put QR codes on the pews to make it easy to give to the Capital Campaign, or Sunday collection or whatever the cause?** We wish to keep our pews, pews, and not ads. We are looking into having in the bulletin a regular QR code for this.
- **Would SPB consider a "hearing loop" to those with disabilities?** When we explored different options, the one we have now served to be the best. Those who have used it truly have appreciated its magnificent frequency and support. And answering a related request, this company only makes certain sizes of hearing devices: Sorry you will have to hold the device to use.
- **Praying to Please return the crucifix from the past! It is important to focus on the crucified Lord.** The Pastoral Council and I were perplexed which crucifix this person was referring to in our church because we all believe that the one in the sanctuary speaks to the theological mystery and the architecture of the church. (Having a name sometimes helps on these suggestions so we can ask for clearer information and something we are missing or not hearing.) *More next week since we received about 20 in the box!*

6:30 SUNDAY: WE NEED YOUR HELP! This Mass has grown in participation: we need additional Communion Ministers, lectors and ushers. On October 19, we had our largest crowd at this Mass since COVID, but only four Communion Ministers. It's not that we want to rush, but it assists and facilitates things for the ritual and also allows for more folks to share their baptismal service. We also appreciate the youth coming forward to usher, too!



THE JUBILEE YEAR IS ENDING SOON – HAVE YOU MADE A VISIT TO SAINT ANN?

We always enjoy the impromptu weekend visits of folks from other parishes who want to make their jubilee pilgrimages to holy doors across the diocese, the nation and the world. **HELP WITH THE ADVENT WREATH AT MASS & PREPARE:**

It's time to finalize our Advent plans together! Time to purchase our Advent Candles, calendars, wreath and such to keep the sacred day and times holy for us. (Great Advent Calendars at the big box store next to 271!) Our theme is "Jesus Christ, Hope for the World," with our theme song for the event, the famous song we sing a lot of times at Communion.

For the Advent Wreath, we keep our tradition of needing folks to assist, or if you wish, if the Mass is for your family, please let the priest know, even a week ahead of time. Here's what we do:

- Before Mass, the priest and/or George (depending on the Mass time) recruit a parish family to light the wreath.
- On the First week of Advent after the homily, the priest invites the family forward during the Creed to come into the sanctuary to light the candle.
- During the last prayer of the Universal Prayers, the "Blessing of the Advent Wreath" is recited.
- After the prayer, the family lights the candle and all sing "Rejoice, Rejoice..." from "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."
- On the next three Sundays, the family lights the candle during the Opening Procession and Song. The priest has the family go before him; they go to the Advent Wreath and light the candle while we are singing the Opening Song. The family comes down next to the priest and they bow together in reverence to the altar.
- A family can request to light the wreath, or one is chosen usually by a priest, and they process into the church with the priest and altar servers at the beginning of Mass. Those who volunteer ahead of time are listed on the bulletin board in the vesting sacristy.
- Please note – there is no *Gloria* during Advent, so don't be late for Mass and especially the readings.

- **ADVENT RETREAT KNIGHT:** A "Yes" That Brings Us Christmas. Tuesday, December 2, 6:00 PM in church with guest speaker Sr. Rita Schroeder, SND.
- **ADVENT GIVING TREE:** During this holy season of giving, we will have the Helping Hands Advent Giving Tree in the Fickel Narthex for your support of a houseless family or another family in one of the other residences across NE Ohio.
- **#weGiveCatholic on December 2:** It's our 24 hours of giving to our parish – and through our Catholic school we will get more tables for the cafeteria – O'Brien Hall. Each table costs \$2,150.00.

- **ADVENT LESSONS & CAROL:** Thanks to our Music & Liturgy Director, Roberta Modica, we will have this Advent custom return to SPB this **Wednesday, December 17, 7:00 PM** in church with all our musicians (singers and instrumentalists). **Thanks for placing this event on your calendar for some prayer, celebration and fun in the midst of Advent.**




