The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER – HAPPY MOTHER’S DAY – Today’s Gospel, from the “final discourse” of Christ, reminds us of His deep love for the disciples, for us! The commandment of loving comes first from the foot washing – the service we are called to live and do for one another. Secondly, it comes from the Eucharist – the meal which calls us to be nourished by God and then in turn nourish and sustain one another with this

food of love. As the second reading from Peter reminds us, “Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. ... give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope!” We hope because we are loved. We are loved and so we are able to have hope. More importantly, “it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil.”

Let us do good – do love – do our foot washing – that is – to be of total service and commitment. By this, we are following the love of Christ. How will you show your love this week?

HAPPY MOM’S DAY! Meanwhile, besides our vocation and guide with God, who teaches us love the most? Our mothers! We are grateful to them and are blessed to celebrate them this week. Thank you, moms! And a special thanks to my mom for her dedication, care and service that taught me how to be a great priest because of her selfless service to this parish for 53 years.

CONFIRMATION: We welcome in a special way and are so grateful to Bishop Martin Amos for being here again to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. We pray for our 50 students who now, filled with the fullness of the Holy Spirit, will take an active part in living their faith. Thank you, parents, for witnessing the faith and being energized by the Holy Spirit to witness anew its gifts and share them with our community!

SEE THE SPECIAL 250TH ANNIVERSARY

CELEBRATION & MATERIALS: As the United States of America commemorates the 250th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 2026, the USCCB joins this celebration by lifting up the contributions of Catholics and the impact of our faith on the history of this country.

In a historic moment, the US bishops will consecrate the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on **June 11, 2026**, and invite all parishes to join in this consecration. For us to be able to participate, the USCCB placed online a special Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It draws its daily devotions from the **Litany of the Sacred Heart**. Each day reflects on the wisdom of saints and pontiffs on the Sacred Heart and offers

opportunities for prayer and action, framed by Pope Francis’ encyclical *Dilexit Nos* (He Loved Us) and Pope Leo XIV’s apostolic exhortation *Dilexi Te* (I Have Loved You).

Join the US Church from **June 3-11** in praying this Novena to the Sacred Heart, which will conclude with the consecration of the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus – live in Washington, DC at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our national church.

Another opportunity for parishes and individuals to participate is by contributing to a collective **250 Hours of Adoration and 250 Works of Mercy**. This guide is on the USCCB website. The seven Corporal Works of Mercy come to us directly from the Scriptures in the Gospel of Matthew. Rooted in our lives of faith, the actions that Jesus calls us to in feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick and imprisoned, burying the dead, and giving alms are central elements of our Catholic identity. Pope Leo XIV instructs in *Dilexi te*, “As we contemplate Christ’s love, ‘we too are inspired to be more attentive to the sufferings and needs of others, and confirmed in our efforts to share in his work of liberation as instruments for the spread of his love’” (no. 2).



How to Participate? Individuals and groups can participate in 250 Works of Mercy by engaging in the existing activities and efforts of their parishes, getting involved in new ways, and by participating with local and national organizations on a weekly or monthly basis leading up to the July 4 anniversary of the country. Our works of mercy draw from the deep well of our faith and prayer, constantly reminding us that in tending to our brothers and sisters, we tend to Christ Himself. Afterwards, please use the USCCB website to report your service activities on their special page to chart this. These works of mercy could take a variety of shapes, such as:

- Assisting women who face a crisis pregnancy
- Donating to food pantries and clothing closets
- Participating in a community beautification program

- Raising money for an overseas development project
- Sponsoring a refugee family
- Tutoring children
- Volunteering at homeless shelters

Organizations to get involved with in your local community include:

- Our Helping Hands Ministry
- Our Manna Ministry
- The Diocese's Catholic Charities agencies – there are so many
- Catholic Relief Services, chapters, clubs and Operation Rice Bowl (for next year they need help now).

A SURPRISE AT THEOLOGY ON TAP: We had another successful Theology on Tap for Lent. Join us for an Easter Time Theology on Tap, my last one as your pastor, at Babbit Road Collision Bend, **Tuesday, May 19, 6:30 PM**. Our topic: **HOW IS POPE LEO XIV DOING? OUR POPE'S FIRST YEAR AND STYLE**. We will look at this new leader of our church, his documents and writings and his plans for the continued growth of the Church.



HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR WORSHIP AND PRAYER: As I am winding down, there is another avenue of our eighth pastorate that is worth noting and part of the “duties” or life of being a pastor. When I made my oath to Bishop Richard Lennon and to you, the congregation on July 4, 2009, I promised to follow, implement and promote the worship and prayer of the church (liturgy) and to make sure it was done fully, properly and well. We have always been known for our fine worship here, preaching and music, especially. Our art and environment have also been outstanding with folks already reminding me of several themes, art, pieces or otherwise that have adorned and supported our worship. **WE HAVE DONE A LOT and GONE THROUGH A LOT WITH COVID-19.** We still have not totally recovered from the attendance numbers we had before

the pandemic. However, those who ARE here are so dedicated to active participation. You hear the singing and responding to the prayers and you are always engaged in our homilies. Not only that, I am most proud of a few things and in ways that, nationally, we have been recognized:

- Our student participation at our school Masses and other liturgies engages our youth and has made them active in the liturgy and quite knowledgeable.
- We started and continued Children's Liturgy of the Word each Sunday for our youth.
- We are blessed to have all-volunteer singers and musicians, not like other parishes that hire their singers or instrumentalist; and we have had the honor of the gift of an artist-in-residence, Bruno Langes, violinist, for the last three years. (Sadly, Bruno has graduated and must move now that his student visa and apartment have ceased; more on him next time.)
- We are blessed to have accompanists, but especially Roberta, who has been an amazing presence for our parish, great planner of liturgical music, and witness of faith since 1978.
- We celebrate Morning Prayer every day, even with a marvelous choir on Sundays, and weekdays Evening Prayer, implementing this full, an active participation of Vatican II that each parish is supposed to do, but yet, has yet to be implemented in most of the Church.
- We offer the Body and Blood of Christ at every Mass and also offer the possibility for a low-gluten host.
- We offer two days a week of regular celebration of the Sacrament of Penance (Monday and Saturday) and have a confessional in the Parish Office for drop-ins from 8:00 AM-4:00 PM each weekday and any time on the weekend by appointment; after any Mass, the priest is available to celebrate this sacrament as well.
- We have so many lectors and Communion Ministers who engage in serving the Word and Sacrament.
- We livestream each week with the possibility of recorded services on our YouTube Channel; we also, when requested, livestream funerals and weddings and other liturgical events (i.e., Holy Hours and parish missions).
- We celebrate the Anointing of the Sick after each Mass on the first Sunday of the month, or any time by appointment, and also have special liturgies throughout the year to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during Mass (i.e., Saint Ann Triduum, Our Lady of Lourdes – World Day of the Sick); after any Mass, the priest is available to celebrate this sacrament as well.
- We offer house or car blessings for people in a new house or car, or for a renovation.
- We offer a parish mission each year.
- We celebrate exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the weekday Masses, on Thursdays and with a once-a-month special Holy Hour.



I'm sure I am leaving out many things! But I will not leave out that I have had incredible liturgical leaders in this parish, well-formed, selfless in giving of the time and talent to make sure that our worship is well-served. I am so grateful to Vera our chair and lector leader, George Zagar our chief sacristan and Communion Minister leader, Greg our livestreaming coordinator, Ken our usher leader, Anthony our dean of servers and coordinator, and our other sacristan leaders and servers, such as Jimmy, Nick, Joe Z., Sue, Peter, Joe P. (who orders our items), Jeff, Carol, Ed and Doug. We love our teams – at 4:30 PM, 8:30 AM, 10:30 AM and 6:30 PM! Other kudos to Roberta, Soo, Bruno, Steve, Dick and Art, our musicians who are great.



Last, but hardly least: our beloved Blessed Sacrament Community! I grew up here with the witness of great brothers and priests working so hard behind the scenes, from their preaching, their Confession time, their presence, dedication and service. I have been so blessed for most of my life to be part of a charism making all the manifest of the Eucharist known. It is because of the SSS, and the men I live with now and in the past, that I strive to be the best Blessed Sacrament Religious, to be like them in my “gift of self” to Christ and the Church. Please always share your gratitude with them, especially our current parochial vicars who we are so blessed to have from other countries to serve with us. Thanks for helping me live and be guided by my oath I swore at the beginning of my pastorate! Please be generous with Father Rosario in keeping up the great work and continuing to a new level of growth and care as we live our parish's 2026-2031 Pastoral Plan.

Thanks for sharing your stewardship with us: your time, talent and treasure. Let us continue to pray for each other.

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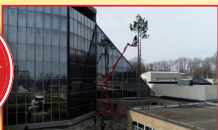
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
