THE GRACE OF BECOMING


We are not the same today as we were yesterday. In fact, if we are, then something is definitely wrong with us!

Each day brings us new information, new experiences, and new perspectives. Of course, we have to be open to these new things in order to benefit from them, and that openness is at the heart of what we call repentance. Repentance seems a very harsh word for many of us, perhaps, but we're only fooling ourselves if we think we've got everything all figured out, and that there is really nothing new we need to consider.

Of course, the truth is the truth: The Living God is one God in three Divine Persons. Jesus Christ took flesh and was born of the Virgin Mary. He died for us and rose from the dead. He is coming back at the end of time to bring us into the fullness of His Kingdom. These things we don't need to reconsider, but how we can live these truths more profoundly—therein lies out the need for the continuing conversion which starts with repentance.

The beginning of the Gospel of Mark begins with a message of repentance, brought forth by the great messenger of repentance, St. John the Baptist. What a marvelous and extraordinary individual he was: honest, strong, single-minded, and entirely dedicated to the mission God gave him, to announce the coming of the Messiah, one whom would, despite his own importance, would be even more important.

St. John the Baptist is a model for each of us. No, we don't need to necessarily live as radically as he did, nor do we need to storm about telling everybody to get it in gear. But he told the truth, and so should we. And he pointed not to himself, but to Jesus, as the One who mattered most. And so should we.



YES VIRGINIA, THERE IS A SANTA CLAUS

And Santa Claus – Saint Nicholas – really lived, and really used his inheritance to do good works for the sick and the poor, and especially for the young.

Perhaps the most famous account of Good Saint Nicholas recalls a poor man who had three young daughters. Now, in those days, a young woman's father was expected to offer prospective husbands something of value, called a dowry. The larger or more valuable the dowry, the better the chances that a young woman would attract a good husband. However, without a dowry at all, a woman was unlikely to ever marry and would be sold into servitude.

Well, this particular poor man's daughters, who were very beautiful, were likely to be sold into prostitution because they lacked dowries. However, on three different nights, a bag of gold mysteriously appeared in their home, providing the needed



dowries. The bags of gold, tossed through an open window, are said to have landed in girl's stockings, left before the fire to dry. They were saved from their poverty, able to each attract a fine husband!

This beautiful testimony about Saint Nicholas eventually led to the custom of children hanging stockings or putting out shoes on the eve of the saint's feast day—December 6—in anticipation of gifts from Saint Nicholas, the renowned gift-giver and patron saint of children, who was also a dedicated believer in the truth about our Lord Jesus Christ, that he was, from the very beginning, the Son of the Living God.



THE JESSE TREE

A Jesse Tree is a way of preparing for Christmas by journeying through the stories on Jesus's family tree. Each day of Advent, we read a short Bible story about someone on Jesus's family tree and then hang an ornament symbolizing the story on our tree. As we gradually decorate our Jesse tree, we're able to see how God, gradually and carefully, prepared the world for Jesus's coming through several generations.

The tradition of the Jesse Tree is rooted in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of David, Israel's greatest king. Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family Thus, each decoration tree. represents a particular story from within the family tree of Jesus, and with each story, we take a step closer to his birth. In some homes,

the Christmas Tree begins first as a Jesse Tree, decorated only with lights and the symbol decorations. Then, on Christmas Eve, Christmas ornaments either replace or are added to the Jesse Tree symbols, and the Christmas Tree literally "blooms" from the Jesse Tree, just as our blessed Lord bloomed from the Virgin Mary, whose husband was Joseph, of the house and lineage of David, the son of Jesse.

KEEPING THE SEASON EVERY DAY: PAUSE, PRAY, AND PROCEED

Prayer is important for both individuals and families, for it is the way in which we enter into a true and meaningful conversation with the Lord. Here is a simple way to incorporate a few moments of prayer into each day.

After making the Sign of the Cross, the scripture verse may be said aloud, between leader and response, said aloud just by one person for all to hear, or be silently read by all. Take time to pause for a few moments and listen for what the Lord might be saying to you as an individual or family (some questions to help in this are provided). Sharing our thoughts with one another might be useful, but isn't necessary. Singing the familiar part of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" can bring everyone together in sung prayer, and then the Glory Be is prayed aloud by all.

We pause for a few moments, we pray in listening and in speaking and singing, and then we proceed to apply what we've learned as we continue our day.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 7 - ST. AMBROSE, BISHOP & DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Saint Ambrose was the bishop of Milan in Italy in the fourth century and was known for his ability to teach the true faith in the face of strong opposition, and for his holiness of life. He helped bring Saint Augustine into the Church, and was his mentor. He also wrote many beautiful hymns which helped spread the faith at a time when the average person couldn't read, and so learned the truth by memorizing poetic texts and the like. "Doctor of the Church" is a title given to those saints whose contributions to the faith have had an extraordinary impact. There are only 36 saints who have been given this title in the history of the Church.

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 12 - OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

This feast goes back to the sixteenth century when Mary appeared to Saint Juan Diego and requested his help in securing that a chapel to her honor be built on the hill of Tepeyac in what is now inside the borders of Mexico City. She instructed him to go to the bishop and make her request. The bishop in response to Juan Diego insisted on a sign, which Our Lady offered in the form of roses which she presented to Juan Diego to give to the bishop (it was winter, and so roses would not be in season). However, when Juan Diego opened his tilma (cape) in which he was carrying the roses, as they fell to the floor, an image of Our Lady, exactly as she had appeared to Juan Diego on the hill, miraculously appeared upon the tilma. The holy faith was extended to the native people of Mexico through our Lady and through her beloved servant Juan Diego. The tilma is enshrined in the church built there, and cannot be scientifically explained away.

Reflection


