

A NOTE FROM FATHER ANDREW

The Israelites grumbled against Moses and Aaron because they were hungry and started to ponder if their situation in Egypt had been better than their situation in the desert (see Exodus 16:2-4). I have always found this grumbling odd. I understand how important a meal is (and I don't miss many!), but the People of God were actually debating whether it would be better to be slaves again. After considering their options, some people preferred slavery to the freedom they had in the desert because of the meal plan. This same struggle goes on in each of us. In baptism, we were freed from slavery to sin and death and have received the freedom of being children of God. However, we are constantly tempted to give up our freedom in Christ and return to the slavery of sin. These temptations are real, and the reason they are tempting is because evil masks itself as a good. Just as the Israelites considered going back to slavery so they could have enough to eat, we are tempted to turn to sin so we can avoid difficulties, save face, do what we want, or have a few fleeting moments of pleasure. Temptations are so deadly because the evil comes wrapped in a pretty package of seemingly good things. That is why we must foster our appreciation of the freedom we have in Jesus Christ. One way to do that is to go through the "desert" of self-denial and self-sacrificial love. We need to choose to die to ourselves in little ways and small sacrifices out of love for God so that we do not easily give in to the deadly temptations of the Evil One. By willingly entering the desert of self-denial, we train ourselves to avoid being defined by fleeting pleasures and shallow desires. In this way, we begin to cherish the freedom Christ has won for us in His Cross and Resurrection. If you struggle with sinful temptations, do not be discouraged! More than half the battle is not giving up. If we fall, ask for the grace to begin again through surrendering to God's Divine Mercy and then commit to the training we all need to stay united to Christ no matter the temptation. This training is hard but always worth it. Slavery is never worth it. Do not give up! We were made for so much more than slavery to sin. God made us for Himself, and there are so many graces available to us for our journey through the desert of this world.




