#### **Parish Mission Statement**

We, All Saints Parish, are drawn together by the power of the Holy Spirit to be a living and convincing sign of God's unconditional love. We are gifted to build bonds among ourselves and others in order to live the Gospel in word, worship, community and service for the salvation of all and the building of God's kingdom.

Today's Gospel recounts the first of the seven signs in the first half of John's Gospel. At first hearing, signs sound like miracles. A more careful listening reveals an important difference. John's "signs" have two levels: the one that our senses read and the one that points to a deeper reality - some aspect of the meaning of Jesus' life. John's Gospel is different. Abundant wine traditionally symbolizes God's generosity. Water jugs of that period contained about 25 gallons. Just the additional wine was enough for 100 guests to have Could 30. 8oz glasses of wine each. we call that a staggering amount of wine? This would certainly provide a challenge to wine enthusiasts. This episode begins Mary. Mary's faith elicited Jesus' response - which was, at first, reluctant. John makes it clear that Mary's faith is central to the action of the story. She is also the *catalyst for the belief of others*. John makes a startling statement: "They began to believe at this time." Mary's faith, her initiative, her trust, brought those present guests and disciples alike - to trust Jesus. As we know, trust is faith. Wine in abundance was an Old Testament symbol of God's salvation at the end of time. This first sign of Jesus in Cana points to Jesus as the source of wine in abundance. John's gospel is subtle; it is not a simple, "miracle story." Do we appreciate the signs that Jesus has placed in our lives? Do we grow from what God has done in our lives and allow it to deepen our faith and significantly change our lives? Do we allow life changes in our relationship with God to spark the growth of faith in others? This is what the gospel is challenging us to do today. We learn from a sign.

#### POSTCARD CAMPAIGN

The 2019 March for Life took place on Friday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, in Washington, DC. This year marks the 46<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Roe v. Wade. The Diocese of Scranton hopes to use this opportunity to promote a postcard campaign around Respect Life issues across the country. The Catholic Church has long committed itself to protecting life from conception until natural death. Recent events, however, have reminded the Diocese of Scranton that our commitment is important not only with the passage of particular laws or statements, but in real time. This campaign will attract the attention of our federal legislators at the very beginning of the 2019 Legislative Session. This campaign will advocate for an expansive view of pro-life values. In the United States today, the dignity of the human person is challenged whenever we fail to respect the life of the most vulnerable. When we advocate for our pro-life values, we are speaking out against abortion, euthanasia, the separation of families, and any laws that devalue those who are voiceless. The postcards contain a simple image and a message to our senators and representatives regarding our commitment to pro-life advocacy. It is our hope that we can send a message to our legislators early in the year to set the stage for future advocacy for life. The postcards and a message from the bishop are available at the ramp exit of the Church. If you would like to participate in the campaign, please sign a card and deposit it in the basket located next to the cards. These postcards will be available for the next two weekends.



#### FLU SEASON PRECAUTIONS

Due to the widespread influenza (flu) activity currently taking place across the state of Pennsylvania and our nation, the clergy and faithful of the Diocese of Scranton are urged to observe the necessary standard precautions in protecting the health of others during this flu season. Because influenza is a contagious respiratory illness, some basic measures that can help to prevent the spread of influenza include:

- Practicing good hygiene, especially by washing your hands frequently with soap and water, and if possible, to use a hand sanitizer
- Avoid touching your mouth, eyes and nose
- Covering your mouth when you sneeze or cough
- Getting a flu vaccine each year.

#### Parishioners should be reminded at Mass that:

- If they are sick, especially with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home for their own well-being and that of others.
- If parishioners are sick or suspect they are sick with a contagious illness, they are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation.
- The faithful should also be reminded that they should not receive from the chalice if they are feeling ill.

# At the pastor's discretion, the following directives may be set forth temporarily until the influenza activity in our region subsides:

- Parishioners are urged, but not required, to receive Holy Communion on the hand instead of the mouth.
- Offering the Precious Blood to the faithful at Mass may be suspended, except for those who receive Holy Communion from the chalice out of medical necessity. Church teaching states that Christ, whole and entire, is received even under on form of Holy Communion.
- Exchanging the Sign of Peace without physical contact (i.e. shaking hands) parishioners may still exchange nods, offer a verbal greeting, a smile, or a simple bow of the head.
- All ministers of Holy Communion (clergy and lay) must wash their hands with soap and water prior to Mass, and if possible, use a hand sanitizer.
- All ministers of Holy Communion should be cautious not to touch the tongue of the hand of the communicant.
