Ministry of Music – Bill Loyack

a) Bill submitted via email that the following Lenten practices will be used this year from choir....silent entrance to start mass and silent recess at end of mass...will use Mass of Renewal during Lenten season with Kyrie being sung...Prayers of Faithful (Petitions) will have choir sing "O God, Hear Us" at beginning, and at end of petitions...approved for Breaking of the Bread for Eater...choir practice to start March 15 for the Triduum/Easter season.

Art & Environment- Helen Nowak Gabriel

- a) Important Lent/Easter dates reviewed
- b) Discussed subdued lighting for Lent and it was determined that only lighting behind glass (in back of Risen Christ) will not be used during Lent. Lighting in church-proper will stay as is. Tape will be put over the light switch for glass backlighting behind altar.
- c) This year's Lenten symbol (for distribution to parishioners) has not yet been determined. Many have volunteered to research.
- d) Lenten Prayer Books will be ordered and available for personal use at home by parishioners
- e) Helen submitted the Lenten checklist and asked for members to review for 2020 modifications
