LENTEN CORNER

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. "Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting." (USCCB)
2. Mondays of Lent – Mass at 5:30 PM – followed by confessions **"The Light is On for You"** until 7PM on 03/29, which will be the last one during Lent.
Confessions will be in the Sacristy (left side of Church, facing Altar). Please wait in the body of the Church. No appointment is necessary. **YOU MUST WEAR A MASK.**
3. Fridays of Lent – Mass at 6PM – followed by Stations of the Cross in the upper Church.
