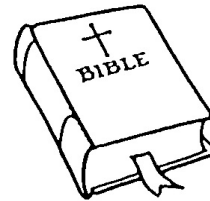

OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

We have been updating our Parish Census and our mailing list. Continuing in January, 2022, those parishioners who have not used their envelopes for the last five years will not be sent offertory envelopes. PLEASE NOTE

This year we will be sending letters at the end of the year to those whose offertory donations were \$250.00 or more pursuant to IRS Publication No. 1771. If you donated less than that amount and require a letter at the end of the year, please sign up on the sheets in the ramp area or call the parish office. December 31st will be the last date that donations can be added to the totals used in the letters.

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the safety concerns during the winter months with snow and ice removal our main focus must be on clearing the snow from the church, school and rectory. The cemeteries cannot be plowed after each snowfall but rather as time allows and as is necessary for funerals, etc.

We will also be limiting access to the front steps of the church during the winter months. The concrete steps can be treacherous in the icy weather and we do not want anyone to fall. Please use the ramp area during this time. We appreciate your understanding.
