Since the beginning of the Pandemic (2020) All Saints Parish has not been able to host and feed the homeless men from Mother Therese Haven. Since last year they are being housed at Saint Mary's Church, 134 S. Washington Street, Wilkes-Barre Pa., but are still in the need of daily meals. The Social Concerns Committee is asking for your involvement by helping us to feed these men. As of now there are 18 men in residence. If you are able to make a meal you can drop it off at St. Mary's between 5:00 -5:30 when the men arrive for the evening. If you cannot make a meal, maybe you could purchase some soda, water, snacks, chips, cookies, candy etc. and drop these items off at St. Mary's for the men. Anything would be greatly appreciated. 
Upcoming Events – Confirmation June 5, 2022 at 3:00 pm.

#### Transition for the Linkage of All Saints and St. John the Baptist Parishes.

The Transition Team met on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 at All Saints School. A summary of the work we did at the last meeting regarding strengths, struggles, hopes and dreams was shared and discussed. One outcome will be to focus on the great work already being done by both parishes in outreach and social concerns. Working collaboratively will be key as we moved forward as linked parishes.

At this meeting, we worked diligently and prayerfully to consider all possible options for creating the new Mass Schedule that will sustain us into the future. The Transition Team studied factors such as minimizing disruption for parishioners, attention to liturgical ministries, appreciation of times for Religious Education and allowing sufficient time for the pastor to travel safely, prepare and interact with parishioners. Additionally, the team reviewed the average attendance numbers at each Mass in both parishes, the seating capacity and parish events that have a relationship to parish Mass times. The ultimate goal was to create a new Mass schedule that could be accomplished by one priest on a regular basis, while giving precedent to all of the above elements of parish life.

After extensive conversation, prayer and exploring multiple options it was the consensus of the Transition Team that this weekend Mass Schedule "IS THE FIRST WORKING DRAFT" to be shared with both parish communities. It will be shared with both Pastoral Councils and all parishioners in the bulletins. Input may be shared with any Transition Team Member. The new schedule will be finalized at our next meeting in early June.
