Since the beginning of the Pandemic (2020) All Saints Parish has not been able to host and feed the homeless men from Mother Therese Haven. Since last year they are being housed at Saint Mary's Church, 134 S. Washington Street, Wilkes-Barre Pa., but are still in the need of daily meals. The Social Concerns Committee is asking for your involvement by helping us to feed these men. As of now there are 18 men in residence. If you are able to make a meal you can drop it off at St. Mary's between 5:00 -5:30 when the men arrive for the evening.
