
As you can see from the photos to the right, both the church and the rectory buildings are in need of new shingles. As mentioned in the last several bulletins, roofers have been hired to install a stone coated steel roof on both structures, for a total cost of **\$116,370**. The roofers hope to be on site as soon as October 1st.

Likewise, in Berthold, the church shingles are in need of replacement. They are frequently blowing off on the south and western sides, despite repeated patching, and we are concerned about leaks. Numerous bids have been received. The parish council will meet to narrow our options before presenting them to the parish as a whole. Again, please start considering how much you will be able to give to support this project. In Berthold, our savings are rather limited. Your generosity will be required to fix this problem.
