FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As we make our way through November, we continue to pray for the souls in Purgatory, that they may be purified and so enter the eternal joy of Heaven. One way we traditionally pray for the dead is by having Masses offered for their souls. It's true that, as baptized Christians, we can all offer the Masses we attend for various intentions. But there is an additional practice of asking the priest to pray for a certain intention at Mass, and of making a sacrificial offering of some money, a "stipend," to the priest for that purpose. The names listed under each Mass in the schedule, printed to the left, indicate the intention for which I'm offering each Mass, usually at someone's request.

In our diocese, the recommended stipend for a Mass is \$10, though a priest must accept any lesser amount, or even nothing at all, for offering a Mass for a requested intention. After all, Mass is free. The money given is a gift. The Church has all kinds of rules about how priests handle these "gifts," to safeguard the sanctity of the Mass and to prevent the appearance of greed or the selling of spiritual goods. One such rule is that a priest, in general, can only accept one such stipend for

each Mass he offers. If he offers more than one Mass in a day, he may only keep the stipend from one Mass. The others go to our diocesan seminarian scholarship fund after the priest offers the intentions.

I mention this here because the offertory envelopes Stanley parishioners received apparently included an envelope for All Souls Day which suggested that Mass intentions and offerings placed in those envelopes would all be offered on November 2nd. As I mentioned, I can't offer more than one intention per Mass under normal circumstances. Thus, I'm writing here to let you know that, if you sent a Mass offering to us via those envelopes, I will be offering your Mass intentions as soon as I can in the regular weekly Mass schedule. Watch the bulletin for your intentions, and don't hesitate to give me a call if you have questions. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace.

There are a few "thank yous" I need to make. I want to say how much I appreciate your prayers and notes on "Priesthood Sunday." Please, continue to pray for all of us priests, that we may be good and holy pastors.

Thanks are also due to everyone who worked so hard to make the "Holy-ween" event a success. While I can't name everyone who helped, I especially want to thank Carol Hynek for taking charge of organizing the event.


