FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Miss a Mass over the summer?

As your pastor, I do care about you. I wish you well and pray for you. And my primary concern is that of your eternal salvation. After all, nothing matters more than where we find ourselves in eternity! That's why I become worried when I notice so many of you absent from the parish, especially during the summer months. My hope is that you are enjoying your weekends and found time to attend Mass somewhere. I presume that is the case. But if not, and instead you willfully and freely chose to skip weekend Mass, even just once, you must go to Confession *as soon as possible*, and before receiving Holy Communion again. Please, for the sake of your soul, do so! As the *Catechism* puts it, "Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin" (CCC 2181). The term "grave" here indicates a spiritually deadly sin, a sin that destroys one's relationship with God, a sin that must be mentioned in Confession to be forgiven, a sin that (if not forgiven) will prevent one from ever entering heaven!

I mention this, as I said, out of concern for you. Know that if you do appear in the confessional and mention this, along with your

other sins, I won't scold you! Instead, I will happily dispense God's mercy, which is so freely given to all who seek it out in the confessional! May God give you the courage to go to Confession, and impart to you a deep love for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass!

Upcoming Absences

Once again this week I will be away from the parish for a few days, this time for a short vacation. I plan to ride bicycle in the Black Hills with my brother for two days, returning Wednesday afternoon in time for the religious education classes in the evening.

While I'm at it, I should also mention a longer vacation and a retreat are also on my schedule in the near future. From September 27th through October 4th, I will be on a bicycle ride from Richmond, VA, to Wilmington, NC. And later in October, from the 14th to the 18th, I will spend my annual retreat at Assumption Abbey in Richardton. 
