FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Holy Week has arrived. Today we remember the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem. On Thursday evening we remember the Last Supper, at which Jesus gave us the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood. On Friday we recall the crucifixion and death of Jesus. On Saturday, we remember the time Jesus lay dead in his tomb. Then late Saturday night, after the sun has set, we celebrate the arrival of the biggest feast of the Church's year: Easter Sunday, the Lord's Resurrection!

It will be an extremely unusual Holy Week. I will be offering all of the liturgies by myself in front of a camera, though I hope you will be joining me (and your fellow parishioners) in prayer, watching over the Internet. I'm still figuring out how to celebrate the Triduum—the most complicated set of liturgies in the entire year—with no lectors, altar servers, ministers, musicians, etc. I will do my best to adapt to the circumstances. Don't set your hopes too high! I may be doing some solo singing. My apologies in advance! The plan

right now is to offer the full Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil, in addition to a Mass on Easter Sunday morning, for all of you. Please pray that my voice doesn't give out and that the technology doesn't break down.

Let us remember that in the midst of all of this, Jesus is still with us. He did, after all, conquer even death itself. This week, let us all walk with Jesus through the Last Supper to the Cross, to the tomb, and out again. Amen.

Blessed Palm Branches are available in each church after Mass. Parishioners may come, at their convenience, to obtain them. Please use hand sanitizer before touching the palms, and try your best to only touch the ones you will take. You may also leave your old blessed palms in the basket or box provided. They will be burned next year for Ash Wednesday ashes.

Join in Prayer with the Chrism Mass: Each year the bishop in every diocese celebrates a "Chrism Mass" around Holy Thursday. At that Mass, the bishop blesses all the holy oils used to celebrate baptisms, confirmations, anointings of the sick, and ordinations during the year within his diocese. Typically, almost all of the priests of a diocese attend this Mass and, during it, renew the promises they made at their ordinations to the priesthood. In our diocese, this has always been a powerful celebration of unity among our priests and people. Due to the pandemic, this year the Mass of Chrism will be celebrated without a congregation present on Monday, April 6, 2020, at 11:00 a.m. CDT from the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit. Our priests have been asked to participate in the Renewal of their Ordination Promises via live stream.


