### *“Could you not watch with me one hour?”*



## ALL CATHOLICS SHOULD KNOW...

### 4. The doctrine of the incarnation

The "incarnation," refers to the awesome fact that God, the all-powerful creator of everything that is, out of love for us, took on human flesh while still remaining fully God. This is what Christians believe about Jesus Christ: he is both fully God and fully human. His body was not a mirage or some puppet, controlled by God from heaven. He really did become one of us! At the Annunciation, he entered the world in Mary's womb. At Christmas, nine months later, he was revealed to us in baby Jesus. He then experienced the full range of human experience, except for sin.

This is what St. John, referring to Jesus as "The Word," meant when he wrote that "*In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God; all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. ... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only-begotten Son from the Father. ... For the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only-begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, has made him known*" (John 1:1-18).

The *Catechism* lists four reasons why God did this: 1) To save us. 2) So we can know God's love for us. 3) To be a model of holiness for us. 4) To make us "partakers of the divine nature," experiencing greater communion with God. As a result of the incarnation, God is still present in the flesh today, especially in the Holy Eucharist!
