## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This Wednesday, we begin the season of Lent. On that day, we will receive ashes on our heads. By wearing ashes "we outwardly profess our guilt before God and thereby ... express our desire for inward conversion. This sign is also the beginning of the journey of conversion that will reach its goal in the celebration of the sacrament of reconciliation during the days leading to Easter" (*Ceremonial of Bishops*). See the schedule to the left for Ash Wednesday Mass times. Below you will find a listing of the usual Lenten regulations and suggestions, along with some new things we are trying this year. I pray they will be fruitful for the life of our parishes. Let us pray for one another, too, that this will be a fruitful season that leads us all to a deeper love of Jesus Christ and his Church.

## LENTEN REGULATIONS & SUGGESTIONS

**Abstinence:** Catholics 14 and older must not eat meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and on all the Fridays of Lent.

**Fasting:** Catholics aged 18 to 59 years are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days, one full meal is allowed. On those days, two smaller meals may be taken, if needed, but together they should not equal another full meal and eating between meals is not permitted, though liquids are allowed.

**Sacrament of Penance:** While we all need the sacrament of confession somewhat frequently, Catholics older than about 2nd grade are obliged to confess their sins *at least* once a year. Lent is a fitting time to fulfill this requirement. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is readily available according to the schedule printed on the first page of this bulletin, or at any reasonable time via appointment. In addition, during Lent penance services will be held at all area parishes.

**Private Lenten Observances:** Each weekday of Lent is also a day of penance. Some recommendations include attending daily Mass, increased prayer, study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence (how about limiting smartphone or tv time?), works of charity, giving to the poor, and participation in traditional Lenten devotions such as the Stations of the Cross, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Eucharistic Adoration, etc.

### Lenten Opportunities at Holy Rosary:

- **Stations of the Cross on Wednesdays** of Lent, starting next week, at 6:45 p.m. Note that on March 9th, the Stations will be prayed fifteen minutes later, at 7 p.m.
- **Journey Through Lent on Sundays:** This consists of 4 Sundays in Lent—March 6, 13, 20, April 3, where Father Jason will give a Lenten talk while the kids will enjoy

fun activities learning Bible stories, doing crafts, and playing games! Father Jason's talks and the kids Bible activities will begin at 4:30pm followed by free will supper at 5:30pm.

- **“Generations of Faith” on March 9th,** is also an event for the entire parish. It will take the place of CCD on Wednesday, March 9. There will be Mass at 5:15pm, free will Supper at 5:45pm, Lent activities at 6:15pm, and Stations of the Cross at 7pm. Each family will be provided a “Take Home Lenten Package.”

### Lenten Opportunities at St. Ann:

- **Journey Through Lent** on Tuesdays of Lent at 6:30 p.m., including a Lenten talk by Fr. Jason each week, except for March 29th.
- **Stations of the Cross** on Tuesdays of Lent at 7:30 p.m., starting March 8th.

**African Mission Appeal is March 6th:** A brief history... The Diocese of Bismarck first sent missionaries to Africa in July 1990, when Fr. Bruce Krebs, Deacon Jim and Henrietta Nistler, and Cathy King traveled to Bura in southeastern Kenya with the support of then-Bishop of Bismarck John Kinney. After violence in the Bura area escalated and raised concerns about the safety of the Bismarck missionaries, the diocesan mission relocated to Kisii in Western Kenya in May, 1994. Since then many priests, deacons, seminarians, and lay missionaries have worked to spread the Gospel via the Bismarck Diocese African Mission in Kisii, Kenya.
