#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

November arrives this week. With it, of course, comes All Hallows' Eve, All Saints Day, and All Souls Day. I remind everyone that November 1st, All Saints' Day, is a holy day of obligation. We are obliged to attend Mass and, like Sundays, abstain from unnecessary work. If at all possible, take the day off. On that day we celebrate the saints and ask them to pray for us. We think of our favorite saints and renew our efforts to imitate their holiness. During the rest of November, starting on All Souls Day, the 2nd, we pray for all the souls in Purgatory who are not yet enjoying the Beatific Vision.

In particular, the beginning of November provides opportunities to obtain indulgences for the souls in Purgatory. To learn about indulgences, watch this video on the topic from Catholic Answers: <a href="https://tinyurl.com/NovemberIndulgences">https://tinyurl.com/NovemberIndulgences</a>. You can also check out Catechism paragraph 1471. In short,

indulgences allow us to aid our brothers and sisters in Purgatory on their way to Heaven, without detracting from Jesus' saving sacrifice.

So, what's available in November? An indulgence, applicable to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if departed. only mentally, for the indulgence is plenary each day from the first to the eighth of November; on other days of the year it is partial.

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is also granted to the faithful who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (Nov. 2) piously visit a church and recite one Our Father and the Creed.

As a reminder, to acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary also to fulfill the following conditions: sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father. The conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the visit; it is, however, fitting that Communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father be said on the same day as the visit. The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of the day.

I encourage everyone to plan to visit area cemeteries during the first eight days of November to pray for the souls of those buried there. Feel free to join me for the brief prayers at our area cemeteries, as follows:

- St. Margaret Cemetery, Blaisdell, Tuesday, Nov. 1, 3:30 p.m.
- Lostwood **Cemetery,** Wednesday, Nov. 2, 1:30 p.m.
- Fairview Cemetery, Stanley, Saturday, Nov. 5, at 3:30 p.m.
- Wild Rose Cemetery, Berthold, Sunday, Nov. 6, after the 11 a.m. Mass.
