## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Following the example of Jesus, the Catholic Church strives to protect the most vulnerable among us. That includes the poor, the sick, the elderly, and the marginalized all over the world. More than any other group, however, our concern is for the most vulnerable people of all: the millions of unborn boys and girls at risk of abortion, along with their mothers. There is no defense or valid rationalization for abortion. It is always wrong. While much confusion has been sown about this matter, abortion truly is *never* medically necessary. There are *always* morally acceptable options that respect the life of the mother *and* the child, including in situations like hypertension and ectopic pregnancies. Likewise for tragic situations such as rape, abortion is not the answer. Why kill the innocent child for the sins of his or her father? And while abortion may seem like it will end the suffering of the victim of a rape, in truth it will only add trauma upon trauma, even scarring the mother for life. No matter the question, the answer is never to directly and willfully terminate the life of an innocent person.

Thus, we must do everything we legally

and morally can do to stop abortion and to eliminate the demand for it. This means helping our family and friends who support abortion to understand what it is, and why it ought to be unthinkable.

In addition to working to change hearts and minds, we need to work for pro-life laws both on a state and national level. State laws are more important than ever, now that *Roe v. Wade* has been overturned. We must pay attention to laws now being proposed in our own state legislature and reach out to our lawmakers about proposed laws. The North Dakota Catholic Conference (<https://www.ndcatholic.org>) publishes alerts and testimony on bills that can help us stay informed.

In addition to working on the legal front, we need to offer real help to mothers in difficult situations, so they do not give in to the temptation to end the life of their child. The Dakota Hope Clinic in Minot (and now in Tioga!) does excellent work in this area. See <https://dakotahope.org> for more information about their free and confidential services.

Finally, of course, we must pray for a greater respect for the life of the unborn. That is why on January 22nd of each year, the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision *Roe vs. Wade* (or on the 23rd if the 22nd is a Sunday, as it is this year), all dioceses of the United States observe a “day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the

right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.” We are urged to fast and/or pray a little more tomorrow for the cause of life.
