Question for Father Jason

Where does Halloween come from?

There was a Celtic, pagan festival called Samhain, on November 1st of each year in Ireland, Scotland, and surrounding areas, which celebrated the end of the harvest season. The festival was also said to be a time when the



boundary between the dead and the living was thinned. Bonfires were lit to repel the spirits of the dead who supposedly roamed about terrorizing. Pagan sacrifices to false gods are also sometimes described as part of the festival.

Eventually, however, as the Catholic Faith spread, the Church saw an opportunity to rid the calendar of the evil and pagan connotations of this day by moving All Saints Day to November 1st. Instead of fearing the dead and performing pagan rituals, the Catholic Church began celebrating the lives of all the saints in Heaven with Mass on that day.

This great feast of the Church was called Hallowmas. "Hallow-" referring to the holy (hallowed) saints in Heaven. And "-mas" meaning, of course, Catholic Mass celebrated in their honor on November 1st. That meant the evening before Hallowmas was "Hallowmas Eve," which eventually morphed into the word "Halloween."

The secular culture has taken Christ and Mass out of Christmas and has replaced him with a bunny at Easter. It has done the same on Hallowmas Eve, taking the Hallowed out of Halloween. As Catholics, we can still celebrate Halloween, so long as we avoid the evil and occult. Let us celebrate all the saints instead!
