## TREASURE AND TRADITION

Does the scene of the disciples being sent out two by two bring to mind any other scripture? After the flood, Noah opens the door of the ark and sends his passengers out to renew the face of the earth. Certainly, Jesus has the same purpose. The purpose is fulfilled in your communion in the Body of Christ today, and in your being sent from the Eucharist into the world. The sending is so important that our word "Mass" derives from it. In Latin, the last words of worship are *Ite, missa est*, which means "Go, you are sent." From that, people began to call Catholic worship the *missa*, or in English, the "Mass." Our English words dismissal, missal, emissary, and mission are all related. We are not sent into the workaday world alone, but in relationship to one another.

Some people have acquired the unhappy habit of leaving worship as soon as they receive Communion and therefore miss the prayer, the dismissal, and the solemn blessing that are essential parts of the Mass. The dismissal is a seal on our Communion and reveals its purpose. Thanks be to God! —Rev. James Field

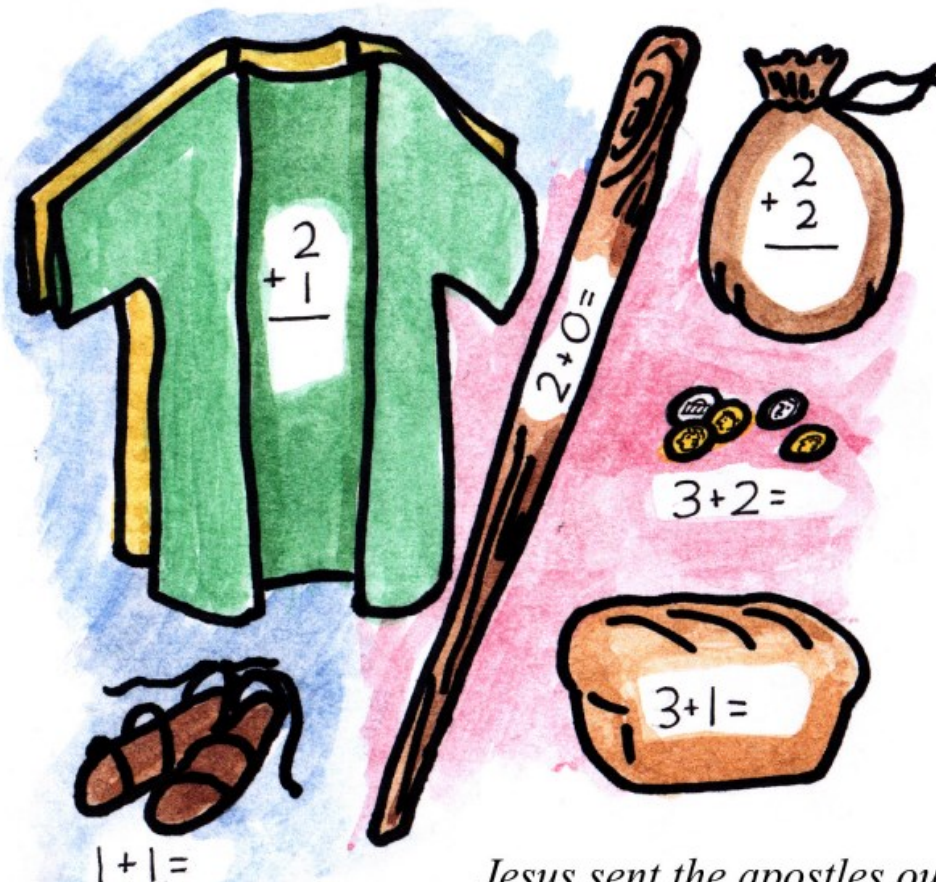
Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos,

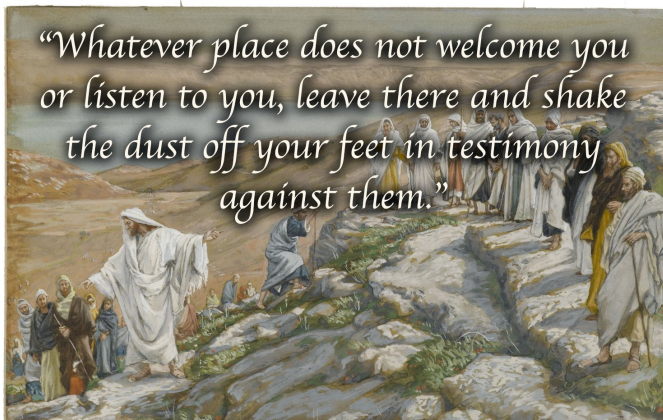

## GOSPEL

## REFLECTIONS

### Blessings and Glory

The second reading from Ephesians is rather long and with only six sentences, it is not easy to follow. To put it simply, he is giving a description of the many blessings God has given us. First is Redemption, meaning that Christ saved us from punishment for our sins by forgiving them instead. Second is the plan of God for saving everyone, by making Christ ruler of the universe. We have to accept these gifts by letting go of the temptations around us and holding on to the love we have received from God. We then share that love with others, so that they know God loves them, too. As our experience of God's love grows, we begin to understand the mystery of how God lives in all people.

Paul also reminds us that we are chosen and destined to help God bring his plan, his Kingdom, to completion. When we teach children how to love and share, when we are honest with customers or suppliers, when we are not ashamed to show our faith in Jesus, when we are respectful of the poor, elderly, or disabled, we are slowly building the Kingdom of God.

Paul mentions three times in this reading about "the praise of God's glory." (Eph 1:14) When we are able to help or forgive, or just be a good example to others, we want them to know that God is in all the good we do. Instead of taking credit for the results, we give God the glory. No, you don't have to take off your glasses and put on a red cape before helping others. Just mention that God does the real work, we just try not to get in his way. Tom Schmidt,

### Sứ mệnh Tông đồ ...

Ngày Chúa nhật, Chúa Giêsu gọi tất cả chúng ta đến xum họp chung quanh bàn thờ để hiệp dâng Thánh lễ với Ngài. Rồi sau đó, Ngài sai chúng ta đi đưa Tin mừng, như các môn đệ sống thân mật bên Chúa Giêsu đã được sai đi rao giảng Tin mừng cho muôn dân. Thực vậy, Chúa Giêsu đã sống hiệp nhất với Chúa Cha và được sai xuống trần gian. Các môn đệ đã chung sống với Chúa Giêsu để rồi được sai đi, thì chúng ta xum họp với Ngài trong Thánh lễ để rồi cũng được sai đi thi hành sứ mạng tông đồ của Chúa Giêsu. Lời chúc cuối Thánh lễ là: *Ite, missa est: Hãy đi, thi hành sứ mệnh được ủy nhiệm. Sứ mệnh đó là sứ mệnh tông đồ (Apostolorum missio), cũng là đầu*

Trước khi đi, Đức Giêsu đã gọi nhóm Mười hai lại và sai đi với những lời chỉ dẫn sau đây: "Đi từng hai người một". Hai người làm chứng thì chứng có giá trị hơn một người. Trước tòa án cần có hai nhân chứng, chứng đó mới thật. Trước dân chúng, cần có hai người chứng, chứng đó mới mạnh mẽ. Mạnh mẽ hơn nữa khi hai người sống thành cộng đồng thương yêu nhau như Chúa Giêsu đã nói: "Các con hãy yêu thương nhau như Thầy yêu thương các con", "*Cứ dầu đó, thế gian sẽ nhận biết các con là môn đệ Thầy*". Các môn đệ đã chung sống với Thầy, đã được Thầy yêu thương thế nào, các ông cũng phải chung sống và thương yêu nhau như vậy, để làm chứng về Thầy. Đó là ý muốn rõ nhất của Chúa Giêsu khi chỉ thị cho chúng ta thực hiện sứ mệnh tông đồ.

Lối sống yêu thương đòi hỏi chúng nhân sống nghèo khó, thanh bạch, siêu thoát, không cậy dựa vào của cải, giàu sang, không cậy thế, cậy quyền. Quyền thế, danh vọng, chỉ bắt người ta phục vụ mình, còn Đức Giêsu: "Con Người đến phục vụ như một đày tớ hy sinh mạng sống để cứu người ta". Chúng nhân chỉ cậy dựa vào Đấng đã sai đi và ban quyền cho mình thôi: "Người ban cho các ông quyền trừ quỷ". Như Thầy đã trừ quỷ, các môn đệ cũng trừ quỷ. Quỷ là thù lãnh, là tướng, đầu mối gây ra tội lỗi, sự dữ, sự ác, đau khổ và sự chết. Cho nên các ông đã ra đi rao giảng kêu gọi người ta sám hối, từ bỏ mọi sự của ma quỷ, trở về với Thiên Chúa là nguồn sự sống, sự thánh thiện và ơn phúc.
