

See in this space our fears and our dreamings, brought here to You in the light of this day.


Gather us in – the lost and forsaken,

A Reading from the book of Proverbs


Wisdom has built her house, she has set up her seven columns; she has dressed her meat, mixed her wine, yes, she has spread her table.

Của lễ hiệp thông dâng cho Thiên Chúa trên bàn thờ của Thánh lễ, cũng được chia sẻ giữa những người dâng của lễ. Hiệp thông với Chúa Giêsu cũng tương tự như vậy. Đó là tham dự vào hy lễ của Ngài để chia sẻ vinh quang của Ngài. Trong cu thể, điều này có nghĩa là vác Thập giá của mình cùng với Ngài.

Hiệp thông với Chúa Giêsu, khi ăn bánh hằng sống mà Ngài chia sẻ cho chúng ta, mời gọi chúng ta kết hợp vào hy tế của Ngài những hy sinh hằng ngày mà chúng ta phải vác như một cây thập giá cùng với Chúa Giêsu, và chúng ta chấp nhận như một của lễ hiến dâng để cho chúng ta và thế giới được cứu độ. Hãy đến với bí tích Thánh Thể, hãy hết lòng tin vào phép Thánh Thể. Bánh Thánh Thể là của ăn cho chúng ta no ấm đi hết quãng đường lữ thứ trần gian để về quê hương thật trên trời.

Bánh Ban Sự Sống...

Có lẽ chúng ta đã không chú ý đến bài Tin Mừng hôm nay. Nghe những lời đầu, chúng ta tự nhủ: Đây là việc rước lễ... Và chúng ta nghĩ đến điều gì khác. Quả thật Tin Mừng hôm nay nói về Thánh Thể và đây là một đề tài quan trọng đến nối chúng ta cần phải nghe lại giáo huấn của Chúa Giêsu về đề tài này với một niềm tin mạnh mẽ hơn.

Mỗi người đều hy vọng tìm kiếm một lương thực tuyệt vời, vừa hợp sở thích vừa hoàn toàn cân đối, duy trì sự sống một cách phong phú đến nỗi dường như có thể kéo dài mãi mãi. Nhưng thật đáng tiếc, không có của ăn nào hoàn hảo cả. Chỉ có những của ăn duy trì được sự sống thân xác nhưng rồi cũng hướng về cái chết thôi.

Không có lương thực nào có thể ban sự sống đời đời cả. Chính vì thế mà Chúa Giêsu đã làm cho bánh của loài người hóa ra nhiều, bánh hằng ngày thực sự, và cảnh giác chúng ta rằng dù có Chúa hiện diện, ta vẫn phải làm lụng vất vả, phải tiếp tục gieo vãi, gặt hái, xay bột, nhồi bột, nướng và chia sẻ bánh cho nhau.

Đồng thời Ngài loan báo một việc diệu kỳ bất ngờ, đã không được tiếp nhận. Thiên Chúa muốn ban sự sống vĩnh cửu, và Chúa Giêsu đã được Chúa Cha sai đến. Chính Ngài là sự sống và ta chỉ nhận được sự sống này khi kết hợp hoàn toàn với Ngài thôi mà. Nhưng sự hiệp thông được diễn tả bằng một lời khó tin: "Ăn Thịt Con Người và uống Máu Ngài", và: "Ai ăn bánh này sẽ sống đời đời". Chúng ta hãy nhớ rằng lời Chúa Giêsu hứa cho chúng ta được hiệp thông đời đời với sự sống mà Ngài đã lãnh nhận nơi Chúa Cha nhưng không đưa chúng ta ra khỏi những khó khăn của đời sống hiện tại. tiếp tục ở trang tiếp theo...

REFLECTIONS

Wise Fools

When we were in high school, we learned that the word sophomore came from Greek words meaning "wise fools." The idea was that the second year student thinks he knows it all now, but still has a lot to learn. The first two readings describe wisdom versus foolishness. In Proverbs, Wisdom is a woman who invites us to her banquet, telling us to "forsake foolishness." St. Paul invites us to give up our ignorance and to know the will of the Lord, by filling ourselves with the Spirit. Jesus says he himself is the way to understanding God's will; he gives himself as food and drink for eternal life. So how will we accept these invitations to partake of the Wisdom of God?

One way is to read the scriptures every day, even for only 20-30 minutes. Take time to think and pray about what you read. Don't do all the talking; let God have his chance to be heard. Read short passages and the footnotes - they can explain some of the obscure references. The gospels are especially good "food" because of all the examples Jesus gave in his sermons and parables.

Listen to the readings and homily at Mass. The Pastor may have some insights that make you think. Receive communion often to be fed with the living Bread. The Church has always taught that we are fed with both the word and the Eucharist.

An athlete grows in strength by eating well, but he also has to exercise to tone and strengthen his muscles. If we want to grow in God's wisdom, we have to exercise our faith. If you have a friend or relative who is a good example of faith, talk with that person about how you experience God or your lack of experiences. They may help you see God in ways that never occurred to you. You could offer to be a sponsor for someone in the RCIA, and help someone else's faith to grow. Your parish or diocese may also have on-line resources or discussions.

God never forces himself on anyone. To grow in his Wisdom, we have to accept it. Ask him for real food and you won't be disappointed. But be patient, God only gives what we are ready to receive.



Refrain:


One thing I ask, this alone I seek,
