



As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."


But the people answered,

A Reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians

Brothers and sisters:

Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the church, he himself the savior of the body. As the church is subordinate to Christ,

so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives,

even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word,
that he might present to himself the church in splendor,
without spot or wrinkle or any such thing,
that she might be holy and without blemish.
So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies.

He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.

For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery,

but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

Chúa Nhật Thứ 21 Mùa Thường Niên (ngày 25 tháng 08 năm 2024) - Năm B

Đời sống là như thế, sống là phải lựa chọn luôn. Chúa cũng muốn chúng ta luôn lưa chon. Các bài đọc khác trong Thánh Lễ hôm nay cũng nói đến vấn đề lưa chon: Bài trích sách Giôsuê thuật chuyện ông Giôsuế bảo dân phải lựa chọn một là thờ Chúa hai là thờ các thần tượng khác, chứ không được làm tôi hai chủ, không được bắt cá hai tay. Còn trong thư gởi tín hữu Êphêsô, Thánh Phaolô khuyên các đôi vơ chồng một khi đã chon nhau làm ban đời thì phải suốt đời trung thành với sư lưa chon đó, nghĩa là phải thuỷ chung, phải tùng phục nhau, và phải hoà thuận với nhau. Nhưng cuộc đời vẫn có những giây phút thử thách làm chao đảo, vẫn có những cơn cám dỗ làm ta bỏ cuộc. Nnếu chon Chúa Giêsu, thì cuộc đời của chúng ta tuy cũng vẫn là một cuộc hành trình, cũng vẫn như cánh chim bay trong khung trời lộng gió, cũng như con thuyền giữa biển cả mênh mông, nhưng trong cuộc hành trình ấy, đã có Chúa đồng hành, cánh chim đã biết hướng mà bay, con thuyền đã có người

lèo lái và như thế sẽ bảo đảm đi tới bến đò bình an.

Trong cơn khủng hoảng Giáo hội hiện phải đượng đầu, các Kitô hữu ngày nay cũng đang đứng trước câu hỏi cốt yếu xưa kia Đức Giêsu đã đặt ra cho các môn đệ Ngài: câu hỏi về căn tính con người của Ngài, về sứ vụ của Ngài và về sứ vụ của Giáo Hội. Dựa trên đức tin của Simon-Phêrô và nhóm Mười Hai, chúng ta có cương quyết chọn đi theo Đức Giêsu để trở nên nhân chứng cho Tin Mừng mà thế giới đang mong đơi không?

Bỏ Ngài, con biết theo ai...

Trong bài Tin mừng hôm nay, có một câu nói của Thánh Phêrô đã trở thành bất hủ. Phêrô đã thưa với Đức Giêsu: "Thưa Thầy, Bỏ Thầy thì con biết theo ai, vì Thầy có Lời ban sự sống". Phêrô đã nói lên câu đó trong một tình thế dằng co: khi ấy người ta đi theo Đức Giêsu rất đông vì Chúa đã làm phép la hóa bánh ra nhiều cho ho ăn no nê, ho đi theo Chúa để mong lai được cho ăn no như thế mãi. Nhưng rồi Đức Giêsu đôt ngột chuyển hướng: Ngài hứa ban cho họ một thứ bánh khác, đó là Thịt và Máu Ngài. Làm cho dân chúng như bị hồng chân: họ đang mong được ăn bánh phần xác, thì Đức Giêsu lại hứa cho họ thứ bánh tinh thần. Thành ra nhiều người chán, bỏ Chúa mà đi, họ đã ra đi gần hết. Bấy giờ Chúa mới hỏi nhóm môn đệ thân cận của mình "Còn các con, các con có muốn bỏ Thầy mà đi nữa không?" Lập tức, Phêrô đã nói lên câu nói bất hủ trên. Ông nhất quyết không bỏ Thầy, ông hứa sẽ mãi mãi theo Thầy. Nghĩa là Phêrô đã làm một sự lựa chọn.

Cuộc đời là một chuỗi những sự lựa chọn. Có lẽ chỉ trừ việc sinh ra và cái chết là người ta không lựa chọn được (không ai tự do lựa chọn xem có muốn được sinh ra hay không; cũng không ai được tư do lưa chon xem có muốn chết hay không, và chết kiểu nào, lúc nào), còn tất cả moi việc khác thì người ta phải lựa chọn. Và chính những sự lựa chọn này sẽ định hướng và đánh giá cuộc đời của mình. Nghĩa là nếu chon đúng, chon khéo thì đời mình sẽ tốt, sẽ hanh phúc: còn nếu chon ấu, chon sai thì cuộc đời sẽ xấu, sẽ bất hanh.

REFLECTIONS

Taken Out of Context

If you want to start an argument, try telling your wife that St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians says she should agree with everything you say. I'm sure that many people have taken out of context the line about wives being submissive to their husbands. In fact, the first sentence says they both should be subordinate to one another. (Eph 5:21) And even more important is the last verse: Paul says he is actually talking about Christ and the Church.

So what does Christ show us guys about being subordinate to our wives? Paul mentions the main example: Christ handing himself over for her (the Church) refers to his death on the cross. "Handed over" is a scriptural term for

giving himself to be crucified. He made it even clearer for them the night before he died: He washed the feet of his disciples and told them to do the same for each other. (Jn 13:14-15) If you ever had your feet washed on Holy Thursday by the pastor, and were humbled by that experience, imagine how it would feel to have the Son of God wash your feet!

Still not sure that subordination is a mutual quality in marriage? Paul explains that marriage is the best example of "love your neighbor as yourself." He quotes Genesis 2:24 about two people becoming one body. So your love for yourself now becomes love for your spouse. Do I love my wife so much that what she needs is as important to me as what I need? Are we willing to listen to each other and support each other? Do we encourage and support each other in our chores and weaknesses? Do we support each other's faith? Ladies, ask yourselves the same questions.

Paul's conclusion is that marriage is a sign of what the church should be. If you ever want to know what the love of Christ for his Church is, look at how a couple in a strong marriage love each other. And if you want to have a good marriage, love each other as Christ loves you.
