



Gn 2:18-24


A Reading from the book of Genesis

placing his hands on them.



Chúa Nhật Thứ 27 Mùa Thường Niên (ngày 06 tháng 10 năm 2024) - Năm B

Con người dùng luật để liên kết hôn nhân. Chúa dùng tình yêu liên kết hôn nhân; dùng mối tình của chàng, nàng trao nhau. Tương tự như thế Chúa không liên kết chúng ta bằng luật nhưng 'Ai yêu mến Thầy.... Cha Thầy sẽ yêu mến người ấy và sẽ đến và ở lại với người ấy' (Ga 14:24).

Tình yêu nối kết nên một, không phải luật. Nếu là luật thì đó chính là luật yêu thương. Hôn ước, có đại diện Hội Thánh chứng kiến, công khai trước thân nhân, thân hữu và xảy ra trong nơi thánh, biến hôn ước thành giao ước thánh. Thiên Chúa chúc phúc, thắt chặt và nâng mối tình tự hiến trao ban thành bí tích. Thiên Chúa liên kết hai người bằng chính hai mối tình họ tự nguyện dâng hiến. Chúa ban ơn giúp họ sống trong tự do, tôn trọng và giữ mối tình sắt son bền chặt. Vợ chồng kết hợp với nhau không phải bằng một nghi lễ, mà bằng chính sự yêu thương và tôn trọng lẫn nhau, đặt mình trong kế hoạch tạo dựng của Thiên Chúa, bằng sự trở nên một huyết nhục, qua hành động, qua tình cảm, qua cuộc sống thường ngày, qua sự chọn lựa diễn ra trong từng giây từng phút.

Bởi đó, hãy sống việc Thiên Chúa liên kết hơn là coi đó chỉ là một nghi lễ có tính cách pháp lý mà thôi.

Cả hai trở nên một...

Luật Chúa là luật yêu thương, có lợi cho con người. Luật Chúa là luật tạo dựng, kết hợp. Luật xã hội tốt lành nếu luật đó có nguồn gốc phát xuất từ luật Chúa. Luật Môsê cho phép viết giấy li dị không phát xuất, không có nguồn gốc từ luật Chúa vì thế Chúa nhắc cho họ nhớ là ngay từ đầu công trình sáng tạo vấn đề li dị đã bị loại bỏ, không được đặt ra. Luật Môse cho phép li dị với lí do chính đáng, luật đó thuần túy xã hội, do con người sáng chế ra. Chúa Giêsu muốn đưa con người trở về nguồn gốc từ lúc sáng tạo đó là luật yêu thương. Thiên Chúa thấy mọi sự tốt đẹp trong công trình sáng tạo của Chúa. Luật con người sáng chế thay đổi theo hòan cảnh, nơi chốn. Luật đó tồn tại nhất thời, không vĩnh cữu.

Căn bản của hôn nhân là tình yêu, không phải luật lệ ràng buộc. Chính tình yêu liên kết hai người thành mối giây yêu thương. Người ta nhấn mạnh đến luật hôn nhân. Chúa nhắc đừng lầm ý định của Chúa. Ngài nhấn mạnh đến tình yêu. Hôn nhân liên kết hai người không phải vì luật ràng buộc mà là yêu thương.

Chính tình yêu gắn bó, liên kết hai người thành một 'xương, một thịt'. Bởi thế người đàn ông lìa bỏ cho mẹ để luyến ái vợ mình và cả hai trở nên một xương một thịt. Luật không có khả năng gắn bó hai người thành xương thịt. Luật hỗ trợ cho hôn nhân nhưng không gắn bó. Liên kết, gắn bó là hoa trái của luyến ái, của tình yêu. Luật không bảo đảm giúp hôn nhân tồn tại. Tình yêu bảo đảm gắn bó, liên kết hôn nhân. Đôi tân hôn tuyên hứa trung thành, lời hứa chưa phai, luật chưa đổi nhưng họ đã chia tay vì tình yêu tàn lụi. Luật không thay đổi nhưng mức độ yêu thương tàn lụi nên có lắm li dị, nhiều phá ngang. Hôn nhân tồn tại bao lâu hai người còn yêu nhau, tình còn nồng, dù lời thề đã phai.

REFLECTIONS

The Way to the Kingdom


The disciples were trying to be helpful. In the Temple of Jerusalem, only priests could enter the Holy of Holies, the men could enter the sanctuary, while women and children only got into the vestibule. So the disciples knew that children never approached the Rabbis. To show their respect for Jesus, they tried to turn the children away. But Jesus saw this as a chance to teach the disciples about the kingdom.

As they tried to send the children back to their parents, Jesus changes the rules. He invites the kids to come to him and even makes an example of them: "accept the kingdom of God like children" or you won't get in at all. So what do we learn from this?

Children don't make themselves look important. They haven't learned to brag about their accomplishments, or how to offer a bribe to get what they want. They simply accept what is given to them. In a culture where we are expected to make a good impression, where we compete to get scholarships and jobs, we

may be more like the disciples than we think. A young man falling in love may be tempted to show what a great athlete he is, or how he plans to get a high paying job after graduation. Yet all he really needs to do is tell the girl that he loves her. We cannot make ourselves look important to God; we can't bribe Him with good works or change His mind with promises to avoid sin. We can be sorry for our sins, and tell Him we love Him, and ask for help with our weaknesses.

Children also have great faith. Not the deep faith that comes with adult experience, but a faith that sees goodness in everyone. If we can keep that faith in God's goodness, while developing a deeper faith that is not discouraged by sin and evil, we are on the way to the Kingdom.

Good liturgical music, is not about the personal preference of any particular person or group. It is not simply about what people like or do not like. It is ultimately about helping the people of God to achieve full, active, and conscious participation and through that participation leading them into a fuller sense of worship of God. Music as part of the liturgy is meant to play a role in the sanctification of the faithful as they lift their voices in worship of

God. Music is the 'Servant of the Liturgy'.
