

In appreciation and gratitude for the 150 years of the Diocese of Providence, Bishop Thomas J. Tobin aptly titled our diocesan capital campaign, *Grateful for God's Providence*. This historic effort had a goal of \$50,000,000 with the purpose to strengthen our parishes, encourage vocations to the priesthood by supporting the education of seminarians, providing for retired priests, supporting our ministries that care for the "least of God's people," and to continue to maintain and support our Mother Church, the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul.

As the Bishop wrote in his introductory campaign letter in 2018, this is an opportunity to express our "Catholic pride" in a very real and tangible way. The Capital Campaign is an opportunity to renew our commitment to support the Church, founded by Christ, and which continues to do so much good in our community, day-in and day-out.

Over the next three years, priests and laity worked diligently to make this campaign possible. With the help of the Catholic fundraising firm, Guidance in Giving, 130 parishes conducted a twelve-week campaign. Parishes formed leadership committees, hosted informational receptions in their gathering spaces, and made presentations at Mass. By the end of the campaign, approximately 400 receptions had taken place. Additionally, diocesan staff in the Stewardship and Development Office and Catholic Foundation of Rhode Island worked to organize personal visits with donors and priests to solicit support for the campaign.

With over 17,000 donations and \$54,000,000 pledged as of June 30 2022, it is clear that the faithful responded to Bishop Tobin's call. In a spirit of gratitude and generosity, the people of the diocese came together to honor those who came before and to ensure the continuation of our diocese for future generations. Thank you for your support of this historic effort. For this, we are truly Grateful for God's Providence.

The report that has been included summarizes the results of the capital campaign, as of June 30, 2022.







CAMPAIGN SPLITS: PARISH AND DIOCESAN SHARE

It was established that 40% of every dollar raised in a parish would be returned to the parish, and 60% would be allocated to the diocesan case elements. Each parish created a list of projects to address with their campaign share. Once a parish surpassed its goal, it would receive 60% of every dollar raised above the goal, and the diocese would receive 40%.

In some instances, one-time gifts and pledges were designated 100% to the diocesan share of the campaign.

An endowment fund is a continuous source of income for a specific ministry or program. The fund grows over time through prudent investing and distributes a percentage of the income to its designated ministry or program in perpetuity.




