

December 4th is the Second Sunday of Advent. The Giving/Kindness Manger Project is only just beginning. The importance of the Giving Manger is that is it shifts the focus of families to giving and doing. So, let's fill that manger with lots and lots of straw!

Advent Project for all who wish to participate. The Giving Manger. See information below!



This year we are offering to the Parish a project called the "Giving Manger." There will be a manger bulletin board located in the church. The goal is to fill the manger with straw or in our case slips of straw-colored paper. A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.

John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist.

At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins.
When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath?
Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance.
And do not presume to say to yourselves,


'We have Abraham as our father.'
