### Worship




St. Faustina Parish, united in God's love, will have a greater consciousness of and deeper appreciation for the Liturgy and Sacraments of the Church, inspiring active and transformative participation in worship. St. Faustina will devote the resources to meet the worship needs and prayer life of the community.

- 1. Create and implement programs that educate parishioners on the meaning and significance of the Church Sacraments to encourage a deeper appreciation and participation by Summer 2022.
- 2. Create and implement a program that teaches the community the meaning, sacredness and significance of The Mass by Summer of 2019. (Teaching Mass slow motion Mass).
- 3. Increase Eucharistic Adoration and opportunity for devotional prayer; include a perpetual adoration chapel by 2023.
- 4. Provide resources to annually increase the number of households who come spiritually prepared for Sunday Celebration by 25%.

#### Formation

St. Faustina will have vibrant and engaging Faith Formation Programs, unified in our mission of mercy, for all stages and walks of life that will nurture our community's spiritual development and conversion of faith, making us living witnesses of the Gospel.

- 1. Create a committee that advises and supports the Faith Formation Director.
- 2. Develop programs to further educate our catechism for all spiritual formation.
- 3. Coordinate family events to allow participation for all family members nurture spiritual development for the entire family/all age groups; provide child care once facilities allow.
- 4. Create programs to enrich and engage parents while their children are in faith formation class.
- 5. By 2023, 50% of registered parishioner households will annually participate in at least one Faith Formation initiative (outside of Mass).
- 6. Sustain and annually increase current programs for adult formation at all stages of life.

"In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path, we must assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice.

We must also examine our conscience before the Lord's Cross. We are assisted by the gifts of the Holy Spirit, aided by the witness or advice of others and guided by the authoritative teaching of the Church." (CCC 1785)

## Discipleship



St. Faustina Parishioners, recognizing with gratitude God's gifts, will share their blessings through prayer, service, and sacrificial giving to become a beacon of Divine Mercy that radiates to the greater community.

- 1. Implement Gifted and Called programs to help parishioners recognize their gifts and share in service to the community.
- 2. Create a work group comprised of ministry leaders, staff and clergy to develop ministry guidelines.
- 3. Coordinate family events to allow participation by all family members.
- 4. Develop a parish ministry council to foster communication and collaboration among parish ministries to increase stewardship and discipleship.
- 5. Create programs such as leadership development and retreats to inspire, sustain, and enrich ministry leaders and ministries.
- 6. Celebrate Stewardship Sunday to foster prayer, service and sacrificial giving.

St. Faustina, like a fire spreading across a field, will go out into the community to bear witness and be examples of our Catholic faith through merciful service, igniting God's transformative love in others.

- 1. Develop resources within the parish to provide spiritual guidance and support to community members with specific needs by June 2023.
- 2. Increase parish participation in five community-wide events by June 2020.
- 3. Appoint an Outreach Coordinator to identify and organize service opportunities to perform spiritual and corporal works of mercy in the broader community by 2022.
- 4. Create an annual ecumenical, inter-religious event with another faith community by 2021.
- 5. Coordinate emergency response with neighboring faith communities by 2022.

# Engagement

St. Faustina, acknowledging the blessing of our great cultural diversity, will be an inclusive community where Parishioners have a sense of belonging and are aware of service opportunities in order to contribute to our parish life and mission.

- 1. Create a committee focused on celebrating cultural diversity and fostering unity.
- 2. Increase and sustain the number of Small Christian Communities.
- 3. Increase the number of opportunities and events that facilitate parishioner interactions.
- 4. Hire a Communications Director by December 2018 in order to develop and implement a parish communications plan by Summer 2019.
- 5. Expand the scope and resources of the Welcome Committee beginning Summer 2020 to actively reach out and engage new parishioners.
