

From the Office of Liturgy and Music

Today is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week, our Christian Passover celebration. Please check the bulletin for the full details of liturgical and musical offerings this week.

Good Friday evening at 8pm, the Cathedral Choir will present the service of Tenebrae, meaning "Darkness." This hour-long meditation on the suffering of Christ includes chanted Psalms, hymns, choral anthems and the chanting of the Lamentations of Jeremiah. Throughout the service, the Cathedral candles and lights are extinguished one by one as the darkness of the tomb envelopes our sanctuary. This is a beautiful and haunting way to observe Good Friday if you cannot attend the principle Passion Liturgy at 1.30pm.

A final note: if you count backward 9 months from Christmas you arrive at today's date of 25 March, which, were it not a Lenten Sunday, would be celebrated as the Annunciation of the Lord, the day on which we commemorate the Archangel Gabriel's news to our Blessed Mother that she was with child and that he is the Son of God. Holy Week and Easter Week both take precedence over this feast, so, rather than transferring it to the following day, it will be celebrated on Monday, 9 April.

On behalf of all of the volunteer and professional musicians who will make this Holy Week a memorable one, I wish you and your family and happy and holy Eastertide!
