The First Friday Devotions especially recognize the Sacred Heart of Jesus and through them, we offer reparation for sin. According to the words of Christ through His apportionments to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, there are twelve promises to those who practice the First Friday Devotions:

- 1) I will give them all of the graces necessary for their state of life
- 2) I will establish peace in their houses
- 3) I will comfort them in all their afflictions
- 4) I will be their strength during life and above all during death
- 5) I will bestow a large blessing upon all their undertakings
- 6) Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and the infinite ocean of mercy
- 7) Tepid souls shall grow fervent
- 8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection
- 9) I will bless every place where a picture of my Heart shall be set up and honored
- 10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts
- 11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be blotted out
- 12) I promise the gift of final penitence to those who receive the Eucharist on the First Friday in nine consecutive months

## From the Office of Liturgy and Music

Authentic liturgical music is the servant of the sacred rites. "The role of music is to serve the needs of the Liturgy and not to dominate it, seek to entertain, or draw attention to itself or the musicians. The primary role of music in the Liturgy is to help the members of the gathered assembly to join themselves with the action of Christ and to give voice to the gift of faith." (*Sing to the Lord*, IV.C.125) The liturgy shapes us into the community of the faithful and equips us to make moral choices consistent with the Christian vocation. It is not group therapy. Thus while personal expression is appropriate in devotional and private contexts, the liturgical assembly is not the property of any individual consciousness or is its playground. "Not every kind of music can have a place in Christian worship. It has its standards, and that standard is the Lo-gos. Does it [music] integrate man by drawing him to what is above, or does it cause his disintegration into formless intoxication or mere sensuality?" (Benedict XVI, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*, p. 151)

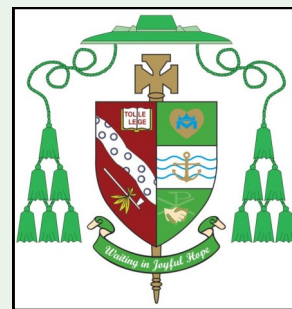
