## From the Office of Liturgy and Music



An article recently appeared in the journal *Sacred Music* a publication of the Church Music Association of America dealing with a reassessment of the state of Catholic liturgical music in the US by Deacon Patrick Cunningham. He makes some very good observations in this article and I'm going to use it as the basis for this year's Lenten series of columns. First, it is helpful to be reminded that the official intent of Vatican II was "to impart an ever increasing vigor to the Christian life of the faithful" (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* par. 1) although whether or not it has accomplished this is certainly debatable. The document calls to mind the great heritage of sacred music, specifically Gregorian chant which is given "the first place" ("*principem locum obtineat*"), not "pride of place" as this phrase is usually mistranslated. This created something of a dissonance with the provisions for the liturgy to be celebrated in vernacular languages. Do we throw out the treasury of sacred music that was singled out as most suited to the liturgy because it retains the Latin language? Or do we "settle" for a pastiche liturgy with some parts in English, some parts in Latin, among other languages mixed in to this "melting pot?"

This is done without rehashing the hurtful events of the past. The work is done in small groups facilitated by mental health professionals and a priest. The Program is a gift of the diocese at no cost to participants.
