

Pastor's Corner

The Council of Nicaea in 325 AD, the city located in the present Turkey, was convoked by the Emperor Constantine to settle the dispute between Arius, a heretic (Arianism), who taught that Christ could not be Divine and be Human at the same time and Athanasius (Saint), who was a priest from Alexandria under the Archbishop Alexander of Alexandria, the present Egypt. This council was attended by many Bishops. During the council, Athanasius argued that if Christ's full humanity is denied as the heretic Arius claimed, then the power of Christ to redeem mankind will be limited; rather, he firmly argued that Christ is both fully Human and fully Divine which may be a mystery to the common mind, but it is nevertheless true. Christ, therefore is fully Divine because He is God, consubstantial with the Father and fully Human taking our flesh Blessed Virgin Mary but without sin (The Incarnation). So it was at the Council of Nicaea that Athanasius established this fact and Arius was banished as a heretic. And this is where we received the Creed, which we recite at every Sunday or every Solemnity Mass. Some other Christians, too, use it, even though some may have tweaked it.

Therefore, after we have listened both to the readings and the homily, the priest, who at Liturgy may be addressed as the president or the presider, because he presides over the Liturgical worship to God on behalf of God's people. After the homily it is liturgically recommended that the presider (the priest) sits down in the presider's chair for a few moments to allow the word of God to sink in both to the assembly and onto himself. So when you notice a quiet moment after the homily, relax your mind and recall any word or phrase that strikes you during either the readings or the homily. Do not be uncomfortable for such silence or be asking yourself: "Why is the priest wasting time or wasting my time?" No, that would not help you to appreciate the richness of the liturgy of the Word, which God provides us at Mass.

At the end of the silent moment, the presider stands, together with the assembly. (Please note: when I use Assembly, it means the Congregation; and when I use Presider, or president, it means the priest celebrant.) When the priest celebrant stands

he invites the people to recite the Creed; in some Catholic Churches or countries it is sung. This recitation is to affirm our Faith in Our God the Creator, through His Only Begotten Son and in Unity of the Holy Spirit, the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church handed over to us by Christ Himself through His Apostles and those who were followers of those Apostles—Apostolic Tradition. This recitation is called the "Profession of Faith". When this is finished, the priest opens the Prayer of the Faithful. If a Deacon is present at Mass, it is liturgically appropriate that he prays the Prayers of the Faithful, bearing in mind to pray for the Church, headed by our Pope, and other needs of the congregation. In the absence of a Deacon, the Lector does it. At the end, the presider closes the Prayers of the Faithful with a prayer bringing all petitions to God. This brings to an end the Liturgy of the Word. God bless you!
