ST ANN PARISH LIFE...come and be with us

Did you Know.....



July 21st was the Feast Day of Blessed Bl. Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan, Priest and founder of the Salvatorians (1848-1918).

+John Baptist Jordan was born into a poor family in Gurtwell, Germany. His family's poverty prevented him from completing his studies and entering seminary and he spent some years working as an itinerant painter and laborer.

+In time, he was able to begin seminary studies and he was ordained a priest on July 21, 1878. Father Jordan had demonstrated a proficiency with languages and his archbishop sent him to Rome to study Greek and Semitic languages.

+Father Jordan became increasingly aware that God was calling him to establish a new apostolic work in the Church, envisioning a collaborative society of priests, religious and lay people who would promote the Catholic Faith through the world.

+On December 8, 1881, Father Jordan and a small group of companions professed religious vows establishing the "Apostolic Teaching Society". At the time of his profession, Father Jordan took the religious name "Francis Mary of the Cross"

+In the years that followed, the Society Father Jordan founded was transformed into two distinct religious communities, one including priests and brothers and the other, a new community of religious sisters cofounded with Blessed Mary of the Apostles (Therese von Wullenweber). Given a new name and now dedicated to the Divine Savior, these communities became known as the Salvatorians.

+Father Jordan spent the remainder of his life governing the community of priests and brothers and overseeing the establishment of new missions in several countries, as well as the ongoing publishing and educational projects of the young community.

+Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross died on September 8, 1918, in Frilbourg, Switzerland, where he had been forced to relocate during the First World War. He was beatified on May 15, 2021.

+Today, Salvatorian priests, brothers, sisters, and lay members serve in a myriad of ministries in nearly 45 countries, inspired by Father Jordan's vision of collaboration and universality.

Message from Bishop Vasques

Let us remember that ministry flows from worship. In sacramental theology there is an axiom—*lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi*. This Latin phrase means that our prayer leads to belief which leads to living out our faith. Every time we worship God worthily in the Mass and daily prayer we are spiritually fortified to go out and minister to the world in word and deed. The ministry we do for the poor, the elderly, the sick, the young, and those on the fringes of society remains vitally important precisely because of the encounter we have with God in the sacraments and in prayer. This daily work is made holy and, as such, more effective, as a direct result of our worship of God. During this time of Eucharistic Revival, let us spend time with our Lord in adoration so that our ministry in the parish and our work in the world will be "rightly ordered" and bear much fruit.

Catholic Social Teaching Corner

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel the disciples ask Jesus to teach them to pray and he gives them what we call "the Lord's prayer". The Hebrew word which begins the prayer is "Abba" which translates to "papa" or "daddy". In other words, Jesus invites us as disciples to pray intimately with God. This intimacy with God implies intimacy with one another. If God is our father, then we have many brothers and sisters. In our prayer, do we remember to pray for their needs as well as our own? Is our prayer stretching us to embrace the needs of the poor, the needy and vulnerable throughout our world?
