

A Blessed and Merry Christmas

An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them ...” (Lk. 2:9). Before the shepherd saw God, they saw angels. They didn’t expect to see either. They were just doing their forgotten job on yet another cold, dark night. *And then ...*

If we asked them what they thought God looked like, they probably would have looked at us sideways. The shepherds didn’t go to Church. They might not have thought of God a lot. They may have even thought that they, with their unnoticed life at the edges of society, wandering from place to place, didn’t fit in with God, if He existed at all. *And then ...*

Their first repose to the angel was to be afraid. But the angel talked them out of fear: “Be not afraid: for behold I bring you good news of a great joy which will be for all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord” (Lk. 2:10-11). The angel didn’t go to the palace, the government or the temple. The angel went to the shepherds. *And then ...*

The angel went to the shepherds. And through the shepherds, the angels sent their message of joy to “all the people”: To us is born a Savior. That is what God looks

like: a Savior. The Savior intervenes not with grand universal power, but as the smallest most unnoticed joy: “a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger” (Lk. 2:12).

Unnoticed shepherds; an unnoticed manger; an unnoticed stable; and an unnoticed child. That was the path to God Himself. “And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ‘Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased’” (Lk. 2:13-14).

Sometimes we think we don’t matter. We don’t look for God because we don’t expect to find Him. And we forget we are not looking. And then, the unexpected angel hints at something, Someone, more. This Christmas, notice the miracle already unfolding within the ordinarily unnoticed things. And look there for Him.

Together with Msgr. Flanigan, Msgr. Jenkins, Fr. Moriarty, Deacon Jack, and our team in the parish office, have a most blessed Christmas and joyful holiday season! Thank you for your support throughout the year and the beautiful way you embrace the faith – our greatest gift!

In February, 37 of our parish children received the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation by Bishop Michael J. Fitzgerald.




We welcomed six RCIA members who entered into the Catholic Faith during the Easter Vigil Mass.

Three Days of Prayer Seeking the Intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis

October 8, 9 and 10

Our Triduum Seeking the Intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis was held in October. During our three-day mission, guest speaker Father Patrick Mary Briscoe, O.P., taught us about Blessed Carlo Acutis, the first millennial to be considered for sainthood in the Catholic Church.



The first-class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis was available for veneration.



Afternoon Triduum sessions, led by Fr. Briscoe, were well attended. Together, we learned about Eucharistic Miracles.

We had a tremendous response to the Mass for the Anointing of the Sick, a central part of the Triduum.

LED lighting was installed in 68 light fixtures in our church and gathering areas. LEDs produce brighter light with up to 90% more efficiency than our previous lighting.



On Saturday, June 3rd, we hosted Matt Lozano, author of *Free to Be Holy: Discovering Who You Are in Christ*. Lozano shared that living a holy life is possible and offered an encouraging perspective on how Catholics can do this.



Our parish and Holy Family Regional Catholic School collected 80 turkeys and 20 oven roaster chickens to be donated to the Missionary Sisters of Charity in Chester for their Thanksgiving outreach.

Parents must be registered parishioners. Godparents must provide a letter of eligibility from their respective pastor. Call the parish office to plan for the Baptism of your child and to register for Pre-Jordan class.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to meet with a priest prior to making other arrangements, at least six months in advance. All couples must attend Pre-Cana class.
