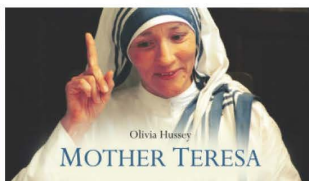

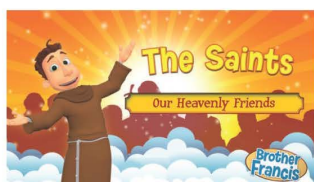

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The Gospel today is the story of Jesus sending the Twelve out *two by two* to preach the gospel message and bring the comfort and healing of God to others. Jesus instructs them not to get weighed down by belongings but to trust that he is with them and to be open to the hospitality of others. This missionary spirit that we hear about in the Gospel is a reminder that all of us are called to participate in the same work as the first disciples. While most of us may not see ourselves as natural missionaries or may not be comfortable going from town to town to spread the good news, especially without all our belongings, we can all do something to share the gift of faith with others. This is also at the heart of the evangelization message that has been the focus of the papacy of Pope Francis. We all have the ability to share our faith in meaningful ways, especially through our actions.

Who can we share the goodness of God with today?

One of the ways we are asked to support the missionary spirit of the Church is by supporting the annual **Missionary Appeal**. Next weekend, Fr. David Baltz of the **Comboni Missionaries of the Heart of Jesus** will be at all the Masses to make an appeal on behalf of his community and the work they do around the world. They especially bring the good news of Jesus to the poor and abandoned. This is an important message for all of us to hear as there are critical situations happening in our country and many others that call us to reach out with compassion to the most vulnerable around us. There will be a second collection after Communion at each Mass. We ask that you please make any checks payable to Presentation Church as we will then forward one check to the Comboni Missionaries. Your generosity and support of the missions is appreciated.

Please mark your calendars for the upcoming **Listening Session** being held in our parish as part of the Visioning process for our diocese being implemented by **Bishop Johnston**. 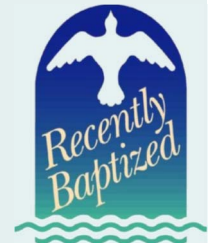

Why are we conducting a Capital Campaign?

Since our last renovation in 2012, our parish has been blessed with continued growth. While we have addressed many needs, we are still faced with some aging facilities and inadequate space to meet our ministry needs. To best serve the needs of our growing community and provide opportunities for our parishioners to grow in their faith, we want to move forward with the next phase of our parish projects. The purpose of this campaign is to expand and improve our facilities so we can continue our vision as a faith community.

Why aren't we building the parish hall first?

After receiving the final planning study report and realizing we could not complete all of the projects proposed in the planning study, parish leadership re-evaluated the projects and the parish's immediate needs. Based upon the recommendations and fundraising projections from the Steier Group, we decided to first address the projects that most benefit the daily and weekly life of the parish. However, the parish hall is part of our parish Master Plan, and we will continue to keep that possibility in front of us.

Décimo Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

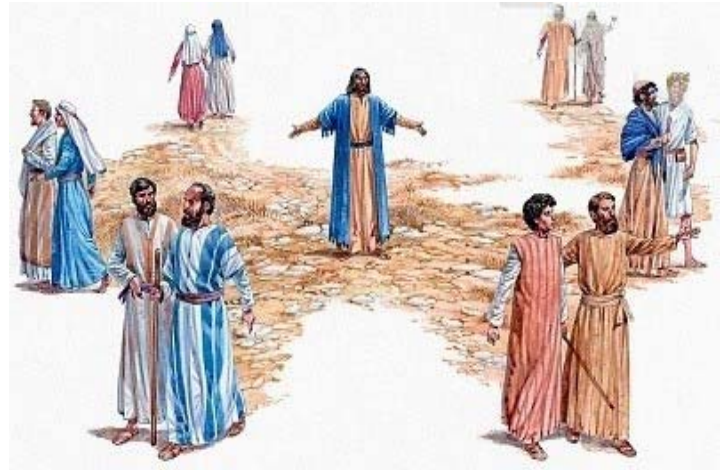
Queridos hermanos y hermanas, hoy estamos celebrando el 15 domingo del tiempo ordinario y las lecturas de hoy nos invitan al discipulado. Así como Jesús envía a los doce de dos en dos, también nos está enviando a cada uno de nosotros a ser sus discípulos en un mundo que cada día se aleja más de él.

El Santo Padre el Papa Francisco nos dice que hoy en día todavía hay mucha gente que no conoce a Jesucristo. Por eso es tan urgente la misión ad gentes, en la que todos los miembros de la Iglesia están llamados a participar, ya que la Iglesia es misionera por naturaleza: la Iglesia ha nacido "en salida". La Jornada Mundial de las Misiones es un momento privilegiado en el que los fieles de los diferentes continentes se comprometen con oraciones y gestos concretos de solidaridad para ayudar a las iglesias jóvenes en los territorios de misión. Se trata de una celebración de gracia y de alegría. De gracia, porque el Espíritu Santo, mandado por el Padre, ofrece sabiduría y fortaleza a aquellos que son dóciles a su acción. De alegría, porque Jesucristo, Hijo del Padre, enviado para evangelizar al mundo, sostiene y acompaña nuestra obra misionera. Precisamente sobre la alegría de Jesús y de los discípulos misioneros quisiera ofrecer una imagen bíblica, que encontramos en el Evangelio de Lucas (cf. 10,21-23).

El evangelista cuenta que el Señor envió a los setenta discípulos, de dos en dos, a las ciudades y pueblos, a proclamar que el Reino de Dios había llegado, y a preparar a los hombres al encuentro con Jesús. (*Homilía de S.S. Francisco, 14 de junio de 2014*).

Dicen que el recuerdo de los buenos profesores queda marcado en el alma de todo estudiante. Uno de mis profesores de ética, solía decir: "Crean descaradamente en el bien. Tengan confianza en que a la larga terminará siempre por imponerse. No se angustien si otros avanzan aparentemente más rápido por caminos torcidos. Crean también en la lenta eficacia del amor. Sepan esperar".

Jesús envía a los doce a evangelizar. Esta palabra significa que hay que predicar a los hombres el Evangelio, es decir, un mensaje de alegría, el anuncio de la salvación traída por Jesucristo. No se trata de un fardo insoportable de ideas o de nociones, sino de lo que Dios ha hecho por nosotros. Al evangelizado le llega un mensaje, una carta recomendada, personal y urgente; un telegrama dirigido de hermano a hermano: "Ábrelo rápido, lee. Te interesa. Aprovechalo y da una respuesta inmediata".



Pero no basta sólo con poseer el contenido del mensaje. Se añade: "Déjate poseer por este mensaje. Él quiere guiarte hacia alturas insospechadas en tu vida. Quiere hacerte feliz de verdad". Todos como cristianos estamos llamados a esta misión. La eficacia y el éxito de este envío depende de Dios. Es Él quien da los frutos si nosotros colaboramos y nos prestamos. Hay que confiar y mucho con esa fe de la que hablaba mi profesor de adolescencia.

Sí, el bien tiene la última palabra. Tarde o temprano vencerá. Jesús nos pide también a nosotros que vayamos. No hace falta hacer un largo viaje a una tierra desconocida. El anuncio de la Buena Nueva sin alforja, ni túnica..., debe llegar al seno de mi familia, a la oficina de trabajo, a todas y cada una de las personas con las que a diario me cruzo por el camino. Con mi testimonio de alegría y de fidelidad estaré evangelizando y experimentaré una felicidad incomparable.

El evangelio de hoy nos habla de cómo debemos ser los evangelizadores, como llevar la Palabra transmitida. No debemos sentirnos superiores, ni pretenciosos, nuestra misión es sólo abrir caminos, sembrar, contribuir a que todos conozcan el amor de Dios y su misericordia. el evangelista nos hace caer en la cuenta de que no estamos solos, que en todo momento tendremos la fuerza necesaria para ayudar a que nuestros hermanos dejen atrás la esclavitud, vivan sintiéndose hijos de Dios y que todos debemos vivir en igualdad y bienestar.

Comboni Missionaries Appeal July 21-22

Presentation Parish welcomes Father David Paul Baltz, MCCJ, who will speak at all Masses next weekend, July 21-22 on behalf of The Comboni Missionaries of the Heart of Jesus. Fr. Baltz was born and raised on a farm in Florissant, MO before joining the Comboni Missionaries and was ordained in 1967. He has spent 33 years in Africa where he pedaled 51,026 miles on his bicycle to reach chapels, schools and villages in his parishes. He returned to the U.S. in 2017 and resides at the Comboni Missionary community in LaGrange Park, IL, where he works in missionary animation. He is thankful to God for his 50 golden years of missionary priesthood.

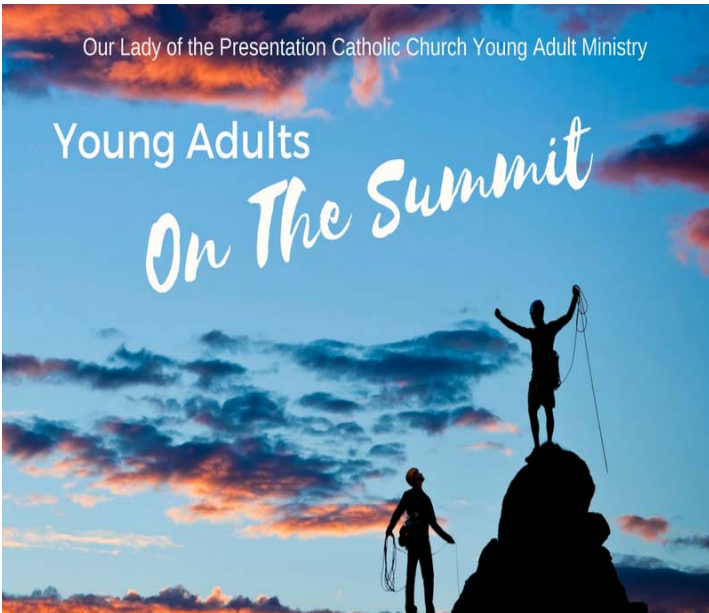
The Comboni Missionaries care for the poor and most abandoned people in any area of the world. Their evangelizing method is directed to the liberation of the whole person through the preaching of the Gospel and the institution of social and educational structures, in cooperation of existing resources and in a spirit of service to the local Church. They are active in the formation of religious and lay leaders, in education, in the field of mass media and also in relief work and refugee location, especially in Africa.

Funds collected during the Missionary Cooperative Plan go mostly into a “small mission projects fund” that sponsors people-related projects in Africa and Latin America. Currently many of these projects are directed to refugee settlement in the Sudan (Darfur included), Uganda and Congo, AIDS prevention and AIDS orphans assistance, training of local missionaries both lay and religious, women’s education at secondary level, establishing wells and other sources of safe water for desert dwellers in Ethiopia, Eritrea and Kenya.

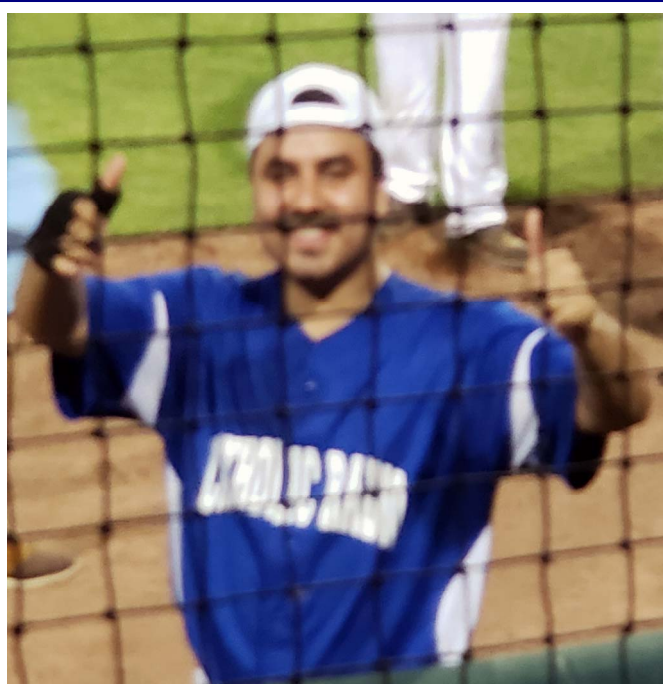
