# Fr.Tom's

In the story we hear from Mark's Gospel this week, Jesus continues to be on the move as he makes his way into the district of the Decapolis. This location is significant because Jesus is moving out of Jewish territory into Gentile territory. This signals that Jesus' ministry is being extended to Gentiles as well as Jews. All are in need of God's healing so Jesus shows this in a very real way as he cures the deaf man with the speech impediment in Gentile land. As Jesus brings healing to the man, he utters the word Ephphatha!, which means, **Be opened!** Jesus is providing the man an opening to return to the community through the healing. Jesus is also inviting the crowd to be open to the healing that comes through following him. As we hear these words, we are called to be open to all that Christ shares with us through our faith. What are we being invited to "be open" to in our lives?
