While Jesus is teaching his disciples about his suffering and death and that three days later he would rise, we hear in the Gospel today that the disciples were discussing among themselves who was the greatest. In response to this, Jesus clarifies that things will have to be different for those who choose to follow him. The greatest among them will be the one who chooses to be the servant of all. And then Jesus places a child in their midst and says: Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives the One who sent me. The child represents those with no power or status in society and those totally dependent on the goodness of others. To serve one of these is to serve Jesus himself. As disciples, we are called to remember that true greatness comes from being a servant of God. Who are we being called to serve in Christ's name?

This Tuesday, September 25, we invite you to join us at 7:00pm in the Mulligan Room for a presentation on Pope Francis' encyclical, Gaudete et Exsultate – **Rejoice & be Glad!** The presentation will be led by Mary Pat Storms, Fr. Olvin, and me. This is a great opportunity to reflect on the call to holiness and grow in your faith.




### Parish-Wide Open House





Josue is a staff person for CIS and has been the coordinator of the scholarship program in San Rafael Cedros since February 2017. He was a past beneficiary of the scholarship program in high school and university for eight years and graduated with a degree in Marketing in December 2017 from the Universidad Pedagogica. Josue also participated in the CIS School for Solidarity and Social Transformation in an eight-month course on the environment.

Angelica is in her fourth year studying a degree in Public Accounting at the University of El Salvador. She has been chosen for her dedication to the program and for her volunteer work for CIS library in San Rafael Cedros. She has facilitated workshops for other scholarship students in the program. Angelica's father was the victim of delinquency in 2009, leaving her mother alone to raise her and her three siblings. Her testimony and example of overcoming adversity.


